

FINAL GAME NOTES - Ravenna won first MHSAA title in second trip to finals. Big passing plays set up two of Ravenna's first-half scores. Clark's 32 rushing attempts and three running TD's set finals record in a Class C game, and his 183 yards ranks fifth on that single-game list. Kent Nichols set a Class C finals game record with 183 yards passing. Schoolcraft's Andy Spencer tied Class C finals mark with 5 pass receptions. Schoolcraft, with a record streak of 10 straight playoff appearances, was in the title game for the third time.
