Discipline also means testing your people skills. To embrace our diverse opponents as equals, and to employ common decency – every – single – moment. Win or lose.


That's the beauty of educational athletics. The takeaways today are not the trophies and medals, but the life lessons learned and applied. Good luck to all!



Coming into 2020, Hudson had just one MHSAA Finals championship in competitive cheer – to go with five runner-up finishes.

Those close calls made the Tigers better, not bitter, especially the 2019 razor-thin heartbreaker to perennial powerhouse Pewamo-Westphalia by less than four tenths of a point.

"Honestly, the runner-ups have been motivation to work on all the little things and to push us to where we are today," said senior Anna Valdez.

And, where they were, was atop the Division 4 cheer world, after using a power-house second round to take the lead and then holding off a furious charge from P-W at the Delta Plex.

Hudson won with 770 points, followed by P-W with 767.80 and Addison at 762.36. The Tigers, who had four runner-up finishes before breaking through for a title in 2018, have now won two of the past three years.

It sure didn't look like it was going to be Hudson's day early on. The Tigers drew the first slot in Round 1 and came out flat, trailing not only rival P-W, but also Addison (coached by Jessica Sword, daughter of Hudson coach Kelly Bailey).

"It's always hard to go first in Round 1," explained Bailey, who is in her 23rd year as Hudson's coach. "That's a tough spot to be in, and we were really nervous today and I'm not sure why."

Despite the shaky start, the Tigers delivered a virtuoso performance in Round 2, which is judged primarily on precision and synchronization. Hudson's Round 2 score of 227.70 was 5.4 points better than the next best score in that round, turned in by Pewamo-Westphalia (222.30).

That dynamite showing turned a half-point deficit into a nearly five-point lead entering the final round.

Division 1



The Rochester Adams competitive cheer team had watched its neighboring schools hoist the Finals championship hardware three of the previous four years.

In 2020, it was finally the Highlanders' turn to take center stage. Adams won the program's first Division 1 championship at the Delta Plex by edging runner-up Plymouth. The Highlanders tallied a three-round score of 791.70, while the Wildcats finished at 790.74 in their first Finals appearance.

Adams had been knocking on the door after finishing runner-up in 2018 and 2019.

Adams sixth-year coach Brooke Miller was elated to get over the hump and overcome the heartache of back-to-back near-misses.

"It was all the determination of these girls," Miller said. "There are a lot of young girls on this team that really didn't understand what it took to be there, but there's a lot of sisters and girls that came into the program that just really wanted it. We just had a really great year and were all so positive and open to everything."

After a pair of solid rounds placed the Highlanders in the top spot, they cemented their victory with a Finals high score (322.10) in Round 3.

Division 2

Allen Park took its turn in 2020 with the upper hand in one of Michigan's best – and most intense – high school rivalries.

The Jaguars got the better of Downriver League and regional competitive cheer rival Gibraltar Carlson during the MHSAA Division 2 Finals at the Delta Plex.

"It was our year," said 15th-year Allen Park coach Julie Goodwin, who previously guided the Jaguars to Division 2 titles in 2010 and 2017. "To be the best, you have to beat the best. Today was our day."



The two schools now have combined to win the past 13 Division 2 cheer titles – Carlson has 10 and Allen Park three.

Allen Park (790.88) triumphed in convincing fashion, posting the highest score in all three rounds to win by nearly three full points, a relatively lopsided victory in a rivalry that often is decided by tenths of a point.

Allen Park led Carlson by 1.1 points after Round 1, then extended that lead slightly to 1.52 points after Round 2.

The Jaguars, performing fourth out of eight teams in the pivotal Round 3, put an exclamation point on their victory with a solid stunting performance and a score of 321.90.

Division 3

For years, Pontiac Notre Dame Prep had Richmond's number. Richmond finished runner-up in Division 3 to the Fighting Irish from 2015 to 2018, before finally breaking through with the school's third competitive cheer Finals championship in 2019.

"We were fighting every year to get over that hump, and then we got over it and then the fear set in: Can we do it again?" said Kelly Matthes, in her 30th year of coaching, and 12th as head coach at Richmond.



The Blue Devils answered their coach's question with a resounding "yes" in 2020, leading from start to finish and capturing their second-consecutive Division 3 title at the Delta Plex with 784.28 points.

Notre Dame Prep (779.18) took runner-up for the second consecutive year, followed by Paw Paw (777.08) and Croswell-Lexington (774.46).

Getting to the Finish Line Surely and Safely

It has now been more than a year since the Covid-19 global pandemic changed everyday life and brought an abrupt end to the MHSAA Winter tournaments of 2020, on March 12 of 2020 to be exact.

Thousands of students could not see through to the end all of their efforts in basketball, gymnastics, ice hockey and LP boys swimming and diving.

Little did we know then that thousands more would not have the opportunity to participate in *any* Spring sports. For seniors around Michigan and the country, that also resulted in no proms, graduations, or even stepping onto the college campus of their choice when fall rolled around.

It was against those seemingly insurmountable odds that the MHSAA – buoyed by its hard-working and dedicated membership – rolled up its sleeves and went to work to provided athletic opportunities in 2020-21 that were taken away from so many last school year.

Since last July, the goal of the MHSAA has been to have three seasons in this school year that all reached the finish line. It was at times a rollercoaster ride to rival any amusement park but thanks to the leadership of our schools and willingness of participants to conform to new and everchanging state guidelines, we made it to the end of the frenetic fall journey.

When the annual 2020 championships in LP girls swimming, volleyball and football concluded – in January of 2021, it was a sense of accomplishment.

However, a cloud of uncertainty still lingered over this Winter's games as the waiting game continued to realize enough decline in Covid numbers that would allow our students to return to buildings and athletic arenas. As with the summer leading up to this school year, and as our winter start dates were postponed time and again, the reality was that kids were going to be playing sports someplace. Period.

Since last May, that belief was proven consistently as athletic activity took place in the club, travel, AAU and non-school space nearly every day. The trend continued the longer school sports were put on hold at the start of 2021, putting our school seasons in greater jeopardy by forcing individuals and families to seek activity out-of-state. It was not only a violation of MDHHS orders, but sending all of those families into different states only served as an impediment to getting students back in school fulltime.

It was always our stance that we could contribute to students returning to in-person learning by allowing MHSAA member schools to begin full activities, participating locally and against more local competition, and under the guidance of trained, professional educators.

The last part – under the guidance of professional educators– is the most important during these times, and thanks to our schools, we proved that notion true.

When four sports saw their seasons interrupted in late November, the MHSAA membership was determined not to let those students suffer the same fate as those did a year ago. Thus, we were allowed to complete fall sports because those teams took part in the MDHHS rapid testing pilot program. Results of that program were overwhelmingly positive. A total of 5,376 individuals (athletes, coaches, team personnel, cheerleaders, etc.) were tested, and 57 – or 1 percent – tested posi-

tive at some point in the pilot. Nearly 30,000 rapid antigen tests were administered – and 99.8 percent were negative. This showed that not only could contact sports be played, but more importantly could be played safely.

Non-contact Winter sports – girls and boys bowling, girls gymnastics, girls and boys alpine skiing and girls and boys swimming & diving – began full participation without delay in mid-January. On Feb. 4, the MHSAA received permission to set start dates for the rest of the Winter sports, with various MDHHS mask mandates in place for numerous sports, and yet additional rapid testing in place for wrestling. While there have been pauses and issues with teams over the past weeks, once again our schools have demonstrated that Winter sports can be played safely. This advocacy for activity will continue for our Spring sports to follow in the coming months.

Our goal from last July is now two-thirds complete. With today's Finals, these students that have endured so much since November have reached the finish line. In school sports, the lessons learned in competition often last a lifetime and for the Class of 2021, they have shown us all how to keep persevering, grinding and believing during some of the most difficult days in the past century.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2021

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 32 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2020-21 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2021-22 school year. This year, a total of 1,356 applications from 418 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored in a virtual ceremony later this spring. Details and a video of the ceremony will be posted on MHSAA.com.



Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

he Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year earlier.

Those eight new members were selected from a record-high 179 applicants, twice as many as generally apply for SAC positions every year.

Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The MHSAA Representative Council

he Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
