2024-25 School Year

Introduction:

With the rise of overuse injuries and burnout among young athletes—issues that often contribute to lifelong chronic injuries and related health concerns—early sport specialization has emerged as one of the most pressing health and safety challenges in youth sports. In early 2016, the Michigan High School Athletic Association established the Task Force on Multi-Sport Participation to support ongoing efforts to promote athlete well-being and address the factors contributing to specialization.

To advance this work, the Task Force launched an initiative to measure multi-sport participation across MHSAA member schools. The goal is to identify statewide trends and highlight “achievers”—schools that exceed expected participation levels based on enrollment, geography, and other factors that influence athletic involvement. By recognizing schools with strong multi-sport participation and uncovering key patterns and research questions, this initiative aims to help school sports administrators shape policies, procedures, and programming that encourage multi-sport participation and enrich the overall student-athlete experience in Michigan’s interscholastic athletic programs.

Because data were not collected for the 2019–20 school year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Spring 2025 survey represents the sixth year of multi-sport participation data collection among MHSAA member schools. As in previous years, all 756 member schools were surveyed and asked to report the total number of students who participated on athletic teams in MHSAA-sponsored sports and the number who competed in more than one such sport. Additionally, the 2024–25 survey continued the practice of asking schools to report the number of sports each athlete played. This summary is based on usable data submitted by 625 responding schools.

Observations:

- The overall response rate for the 2024–25 survey was 82.7% (Table 1), representing a return to the levels observed in the five years preceding the 2023–24 survey. The 2023–24 response rate had dropped sharply to 63.7%, a notable decline from the more consistent rates of the previous five years: 85.2% in 2022–23, 85.0% in 2021–22, 81.5% in 2020–21, 82.9% in 2018–19, and 79.9% in 2017–18.
- As seen throughout all years of data collection, smaller schools consistently report higher rates of student participation in athletics. This pattern appears both across school classes (Table 2) and within the enrollment ranges of Class A schools (Table 5).
- Smaller schools also show consistently higher rates of multi-sport participation among student-athletes. This pattern is evident when comparing school classes overall (Table 3) and when examining enrollment variations within Class A (Table 6).

- The percentage of athletes participating in multiple sports is higher among boys than girls – this holds across all classes (Table 3) and different enrollments within Class A (Table 6).
- The percentage of athletes participating in multiple sports has remained consistent across all classes over the seven years data has been collected:

- Table 4 summarizes the number of sports in which athletes participated during the 2024–25 school year, further supporting the trends described above. Schools with larger enrollments generally have a higher percentage of single-sport athletes, and the proportion of single-sport participants is higher among girls than boys.
- The percentage of two-sport athletes is relatively consistent across all classes, with approximately one-third of athletes participating in two sports (Table 4).
- There is a notable difference in the percentage of three-sport athletes across classes; schools with lower enrollments have a significantly higher proportion of students participating in three sports (Table 4).
- Three schools have appeared in the top 10% of their class for multi-sport participation six times:
