What a way to win a championship. In a top-play moment, Unionville-Sebewaing turned a triple play in the seventh inning to secure a 3-1 victory over Kalamazoo Christian in the 2019 Division 4 softball championship game at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium.

With runners on first and second base, the Comets' Sammy Gano lined a shot off USA pitcher Brynn Polega's arm. The ball ricocheted in the air to shortstop Rylee Zimmer, who touched second base and threw to first to complete the gem.

**Polega** (lower right), a sophomore, had 15 strikeouts and a bruise on her arm.

"It hit me right in the elbow, and I just turned around and I said, 'Oh my gosh,'" Polega said. "I said please get this, and I saw (Zimmerman) step on second. The runner on first was halfway to second, and I said that's it. I was so excited when that happened. To win this as a sophomore is incredible."

"Chaos. I've never seen an ending like that," added Patriots coach Isaiah Gainforth. "Whether in the Major Leagues, college baseball. I played a lot of different things, and I've never seen anything transpire the way that last inning did. I'm just glad we're on the winning end of it."

Polega kept the Comets hitters at bay for most of the game. "My curveball was working good," she said. "My drop ball was good. Right before the game, my pitching coach and I were over there working on it. He said stay tall, keep my arm long and snap hard. That's what I did all game."

She had six strikeouts through the first two innings, and by the end of the fifth she had racked up 12.

Staked to a 3-0 lead after the third inning and tossing a onehitter, Polega never gave a young Kalamazoo Christian team a chance to get back into it before the seventh-inning dramatics. Chants of "USA, USA, USA" rang through the Patriots crowd. It was the sixth title for the Patriots (31-9) since 2009.

USA had a first-inning threat as Zimmer tripled with one out, but she was left on base.

Polega mowed through Kalamazoo Christian hitters, striking out eight through three innings and getting out of a jam in the third with a strikeout.

The Patriots got on the board in the third inning when Maci Reinhardt singled and scored on a throwing error with Maci Montgomery at the plate. Polega bounced out, scoring Montgomery, and Delanie Pavlichek doubled in another run to

The Comets finally got to Polega in the sixth inning on a single by junior second baseman Megan Snook, who eventually scored on a single by freshman Reagan Broekhuizen. Polega ended the threat with another strikeout, her 15th of the game.

make it 3-0.

"She was zoned in," said her catcher, Montgomery. "Everything was right on the spot. She made a couple of mistakes, but the defense supported her."

Especially in the seventh inning.



Warren Regina 3, Howell 2 (8)

Adriana James was nervous. The 2019 MHSAA Division 1 Final had moved into the eighth inning, and Warren Regina teammate Marisa Muglia had led off the bottom half by reaching first base on an error. After pinch-runner Jenna Holt moved all the way to third base on a sacrifice, James watched Howell walk Regina's next two hitters to set up force plays at every base.

Now the Secchia Stadium bases were loaded for the Saddlelites freshman.

James sent a grounder back to the pitching circle, and a bobble gave Holt enough time to cross the plate and finish a 3-2 win that clinched the program's seventh Finals championship.

"When Adriana came up and the pitcher bobbled it ... I have no words for it," Holt said

Added James: "All (the pitcher's) balls were moving outside. I just saw the ball right on the inside corner, low, and I just went for it. We had nothing to lose, and it paid off. I was surprised they walked the two batters because it has really never happened. I was really nervous."

The championship was the program's first since 2015, and all seven have come in Division 1 or the former Class A under longtime coach Diane Laffey.

Howell's Avrey Wolverton opened her team's half of the eighth inning with a single, and Maddie Springer walked. Both moved up, but the threat ended on a Muglia strikeout.

Muglia finished with 12 strikeouts, and Howell pitcher Molly Carney struck out seven and gave up only five hits. Regina finished the year 30-11, while Howell ended 36-4.



### Escanaba 7, Stevensville Lakeshore 3

Two rarities happened in the first inning of the 2019 MHSAA Division 2 softball championship game at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium. The first was Escanaba all-state pitcher **Gabi Salo** (*left*) allowed a walk against Stevensville Lakeshore. The second was Salo gave up a run.

Salo entered the championship game with a 25-2 record, 0.24 earned run average and 337 strikeouts and just 21 walks.

If that's not enough, she had given up only six earned runs all year.

She gave up three runs – two earned – in the championship game, but contained the Lancers enough to secure a 7-3 victory that clinched the Eskymos' second straight Division 2 title.

"I thought I had my best stuff today," said the junior pitcher. "I thought I went out strong. This means so much. Our school went without a state title from 1981 until last year. For us to bring home another one, I don't have words."

The Lancers surprisingly struck early when Salo surrendered a two-out walk and Meghan Younger drove her home on a double just out of the reach of the centerfielder. It was just the seventh earned run Salo had given up this season.

She finished with 11 strikeouts while allowing seven hits. Escanaba finished the spring 34-3, while Lakeshore ended 33-11.

Salo helped her own cause in the second inning with a game-tying sacrifice fly. Escanaba loaded the bases in the bottom of the fourth inning and Nicole Kamin and the Eskymos took advantage of a fly ball dropping out of an outfielder's mitt that allowed three runs to score and gave the reigning champ a 5-1 lead.

### Millington 8, Schoolcraft 0

Runner-up in 2018 – and seeking the first team championship in any sport in school history – Millington made sure it would be heading home with a softball title in 2019.

The Cardinals dominated Schoolcraft from the start of an 8-0 victory in the MHSAA Division 3 Final at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium, a year after missing out on that milestone victory by just a run.

Millington, which also won its first Regional title and made the Semifinals when these seniors were freshmen in 2016, finished this season 38-2-1.


"To win the first championship in school history is something special," said senior Gabbie Sherman. "This is the first in school history to win in anything."


After Sherman set Schoolcraft down in order in the top of the first inning, Millington outfielder **Darrien Roberts** (3, right) got the Cardinals' offense rolling with a blast on the first pitch she saw to deep center field that climbed up the light pole and over the fence to give her team a 1-0 lead.

"It was definitely a starter; it got my team going," said Roberts, who hit her 18th home run of the season. "Anytime I go up as the leadoff hitter, my coaches tell me I set the mood and I have to set the tone and get on base. This was our year."

Before the Eagles could get an out, Leah Denome singled, Sherman singled, Madi Hahn had a two-run double and Sydney Bishop had an RBI single to make it 4-0.

Millington had 17 hits total, and for the second straight season Denome tied the Finals record with four. Sherman had three hits and struck out 13 batters in her final high school start.

# Home Sweet Homer Historic Baseball Program Returns to the Top of the Heap

fter a postseason full of winning, the players on Athe Homer baseball team have become dogpile

So after the Trojans defeated Grosse Pointe Woods University Liggett 4-0 in the 2019 MHSAA Division 3 Final, a small game of "I'm not going to be on the bottom" broke out before the traditional baseball celebration commenced.

"The dogpiles get a little more intense, a little more vicious the more you keep winning," Homer coach Scott Salow said. "Today, I'll watch the video later, but I think it was pretty good. I think they've gotten smart after the last five or six dogpiles; they all kind of look around and wait. I'm the last one out of the dugout, so I'm not going in."


Homer (33-3) scored four runs in the first inning at McLane Stadium and rode the arm of senior pitcher Zach Butters to its first Finals title since 2006, and third


"We've been working to get here for a long time, this group of guys," Butters said. "It's overwhelming to finally get here and win this with my guys. It means a lot. I mean, look at all these people out here coming out to support us. We're a small town, and it's just a great feeling. It means the world."

Butters, who also picked up the win in the Semifinal in a relief appearance, kept a potent Liggett off balance for the 6 1/3 innings he was on the mound. He scattered five hits and two walks while striking out six.

"We had a gameplan going into it to stay away," Butters said. "We saw yesterday where they like to pull, they like to turn over on pitches, so we were just trying to stay away as much as we could and execute the gameplan. My offspeed was pretty good today, and I just had a great defense making plays behind me all day. I couldn't ask for a better group of guys to go out and battle with."

Liggett (24-10) knew coming in that would be Butters' gameplan, but was out-executed.





"He threw his slider/curveball out of the zone, and we just kept swinging at it," Liggett coach Dan Cimini said. "The gameplan was to not swing at that. If you look back, a lot of 2-1 sliders out of the zone we were swinging at. That's 3-1, that changes everything. Give him credit for throwing good pitches, but our guys need to lay off that kind of stuff."

Butters got some help from his defense, which didn't commit an error and also got him out of the one jam he found himself in all day. With one out and runners on first and second in the sixth inning, Liggett senior Alec Azar hit what looked to be a base hit into left field. But junior leftfielder Dylan Warner made a diving catch and jumped up to double up the runner at second.

"It could have been a better catch, but I got a late read on it," Warner said. "Then when I got up, I saw the kid halfway, I just threw it and it was right on the money."

Butters enjoyed his view of the play from the mound.

"I knew it was going to be a close one - Dylan was out there, and he was running," Butters said. "I was like, 'Oh boy.' Then he lays out like Superman, and he comes up with it. Great play."

T.J. VanderKuyl closed out the game, getting the final two outs for the Trojans after Butters reached his pitch limit two batters into the seventh inning. VanderKuyl kept it relatively drama free, and the final out was a roller to Butters at short.

All of Homer's offense, meanwhile, came in the first inning, highlighted by a two-run double from Kyle Compton and a two-run single from Wilson. The Trojans threatened again in the second, putting runners at the corners with two outs, but Cimini went to the bullpen and brought in senior Billy Kopicki, who ended the threat.

Kopicki was strong in relief, allowing just one hit and two walks while striking out two in 4 1/3 innings. Kopicki is part of a strong senior class that was part of three Final Four runs and helped the Knights win a title in 2016.

Drew Zelenak led Liggett with two hits, while Patrick Illitch had a double. Wilson led Homer with a pair of hits.

### Portage Northern 10, Rockford 4

Portage Northern has made a habit of getting on top of teams early this season. There's no secret to that success. The Huskies are just that good at the plate.


We can all hit," senior outfielder Tyler Helgeson said. "This is a great lineup, this is a great team, because if one guy is having an off day, you know that the whole team has your back."

Pretty much everyone in the lineup had a good day as the Huskies pounded out 12 hits on their way to a 10-4 victory against Rockford in the 2019 Division 1 Baseball Final at McLane Stadium on the campus of Michigan State University. The title is the first in Northern baseball history.

The win was Northern's 24th over its final 25 games of the season, with its only loss coming against Division 2 champ Orchard Lake St. Mary's in the final game of the regular season.

"This group of kids is just phenomenal," Northern coach Chris Andrews said. "They put in all the work, and they play for each other. It's awesome."

It was the second trip to the Finals for the Huskies (39-7), who had finished runner-up in 2015. Several of those players, as well as other alumni, were on Zach Quinn (27) and Malcolm Gaynor celebrate. hand to watch Andrews lift the trophy for the first time.



Cam French and Helgeson had the biggest hits for the Huskies, as French drove in two runs during a four-run first inning and Helgeson hit a three-run home run over the wall in right field to highlight a five-run fifth.

They each had three hits on the day, as did Zach Quinn. Nolan McCarthy, Greg Lapetina (RBI) and Gannon Andrews (two RBI) each added one hit, while Parker Brey and Malcom Gaynor each added an RBI.

### Orchard Lake St. Mary's 8, Grand Rapids Catholic Central 1

By the time the final weekend of the 2019 baseball season came around, Orchard Lake St. Mary's was a juggernaut.

The young but incredibly talented Eaglets showed that by defeating their final two opponents by a combined score of 18-1, including an 8-1 victory against Grand Rapids Catholic Central in the MHSAA Division 2 Final at McLane Stadium.

But after a 7-9 start to the season, what seemed inevitable by the end looked far from certain. "That Ohio trip (on spring break), we really just kind of bonded closer," St. Mary's sophomore second baseman Alex Mooney said. "We said, 'Enough is enough, we're not losing anymore,' and that's actually what we did - we haven't lost since. You see all the talent, and it's like, 'Why aren't we winning?' Then it finally just clicked, and everything just came together."

St. Mary's (34-9-2) finished the season 27-0-2 over its final 29 games to claim the fourth Finals title in school history, and first since 2015.

"It's good putting it all together," Eaglets coach Matt Petry said. "At the beginning of the year while we were struggling, we would get good pitching and we wouldn't swing. For the last two months, we've kind of put it all together and we've won every type of game possible, and the guys were just really confident coming into this weekend."

That confidence was evident, as the Eaglets were always in control against the Cougars thanks to strong hitting and a stellar pitching performance from freshman starter Brock Porter (right). In six innings of work, Porter struck out seven while allowing five hits, three walks and one run.

### Petersburg-Summerfield 9, Saginaw Nouvel 0

For a program that had never been to a Semifinal prior, Petersburg-Summerfield looked awfully comfortable at McLane Stadium in 2019.

The Bulldogs were unfazed by the pressure of playing for their first championship at Michigan State University and capped off a brilliant weekend with a 9-0 win against Saginaw Nouvel in the MHSAA Division 4 Baseball Final.

"I preached to them from the first day of practice that we're going to win the state championship," Summerfield coach Travis Pant said. "No stage, no matter who we play and on any stage - we went to Decatur and played under the lights. We scheduled some big games, and I just wanted to get them used to the big stage so this was, 'We're supposed to be here.' We just wanted to show that we do belong and that none of this was a fluke."

Nobody could possibly look at what the Bulldogs did this postseason as a fluke, as they outscored opponents by a combined 89-2 in the postseason, with shutouts in each of their last three games.

"Just hit the ball and field the ball; that's basically all we did," Summerfield junior pitcher Derek Clark said.

The catalyst for that was a pitching staff led by Clark, who threw a gem to shut the Nouvel offense down. Clark went the full seven innings, striking out 11 and allowing four hits and one walk.

Sophomore Brock Olmstead opened the scoring in the first with an RBI single, and Clark made it 2-0 when he scored on a squeeze bunt laid down by Brandon Tyler.

At that point, with Clark about to take the mound, the Summerfield coaches and players felt they were on their way to a title.

# Scholar-Athlete Class of 2021

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 32 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2020-21 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2021-22 school year. This year, a total of 1,356 applications from 418 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored in a virtual ceremony later this spring. Details and a video of the ceremony will be posted on MHSAA.com.

# **Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA**

he Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year earlier.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2020-21 are: Brinlee Barry, Caledonia; Faith Breinager, Frankenmuth; Amina Ferris, Dearborn; Nico Johnson, Britton Deerfield; Brenna Kosal, Peck; Ashton McNabb, Three Oaks River Valley; Brock Porter, Orchard Lake St. Mary's; and Melik Williams, Ypsilanti Lincoln.

Those eight new members were selected from a record-high 179 applicants, twice as many as generally apply for SAC positions every year.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 117 schools from 45 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
