The terms “legendary” or “historic” often can be exaggerated, but that forever won’t be the case with the 2024 Watervliet baseball team.

Going into the Division 3 Baseball Final, Watervliet not only hadn’t won a baseball state championship, but longtime athletic director Ken Dietz said the school had never won a state championship in ANY sport.

That isn’t the case anymore, as Watervliet took its community on a historic ride and punctuated it with a history-making 9-1 title-clinching triumph over Jackson Lumen Christi at McLane Stadium.

Whether it’s parades or festivals over the summer in the community, or for future reunions, the team will never be forgotten in the southwestern Michigan town.

The championship also was the perfect gift for Dietz, who is retiring after nearly four decades of service.

“The whole town turned out, and we appreciate all the support,” said Watervliet head coach Josh Tremblay.

The seeds were sown for Watervliet after it lost in the 2023 Quarterfinals. With only two starters not returning from that team, the Panthers knew 2024 had the potential to be special.

“We lost a game we probably shouldn’t have last year, and we know it,” said Watervliet senior Alex Hicks. “We had a lot built up inside of us that we were going to take it this year. We knew we had the core, and we were ready to go.”

The Panthers finished the job in East Lansing by doing what they did throughout the MHSAA Tournament – pitch well and play great defense.

Watervliet (31-7) allowed just seven runs over the entire tournament and didn’t make an error in the Final, while Lumen Christi made five.

After senior Wyatt Epple allowed just two runs in a Semifinal win over Detroit Edison, sophomore Caleb Jewell was even better in the title decider, allowing just one run, striking out six and walking none in a complete-game effort.

“We knew we had a lot of guys returning with experience,” Tremblay said. “We had really high expectations. We knew our pitching and our defense was good. We got our bats hot at the right time, and we’re really hard to beat when we have all three working.”

Offensively, junior leadoff hitter Owen Epple led the way with two hits and three RBI, while No. 9 hitter and senior Chase Tremblay had two hits and two RBI.

Lumen Christi, which was making its first trip to a championship game since 2015, finished 30-11.

“It’s a special season for these guys,” Lumen Christi head coach Phil Clifford said. “We won the Catholic League and lost in the state finals. You can’t script it any better than that other than winning this game. I’m really proud of everyone.”

Watervliet broke a scoreless tie in the top of the fourth inning with three runs. The Panthers took a 1-0 lead on an RBI single to right by senior and No 8 hitter Caden Burdick, and then Tremblay hit a sacrifice fly to right for a 2-0 lead. Epple then followed with an RBI single to center.

Lumen Christi got on the board in the bottom of the fourth inning, cutting its deficit to 3-1 on an RBI single with two outs by junior Nathan Hinkley.

In the sixth, the Panthers added a run on a sacrifice fly by Hicks for a 4-1 lead. It was the fourth RBI sacrifice fly of the weekend for Hicks.

The Panthers then got precious insurance runs in the seventh, scoring five to take a 9-1 lead. The big blow was a two-run double by Epple that made it 8-1.



Northville 2, Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice 1

In the summer of 2023, Dan Cimini decided it was time to move on after leading Grosse Pointe Woods University Liggett to five MHSAA Finals titles since 2011.

That August, Cimini interviewed for the vacant Northville job after longtime head coach John Kostrzewa retired. Awaiting was a potential roster including 16 seniors.

"I came back and interviewed for this job, got it, and the rest is history," Cimini said.

Indeed, the 2024 Division 1 MHSAA Baseball Final was history for Northville. For the first time, Northville is a state champion in baseball following a 2-1 win over top-ranked Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice in what was a tightly-contested pitchers' duel where a couple of defensive miscues were the difference.

Northville (32-7), No. 4 heading into the postseason, took a 1-0 lead in the top of the third inning when junior Connor Eaton doubled and then scored on a two-base throwing error by Brother Rice. The Mustangs then plated a run with two outs on another throwing error by Brother Rice to take a 2-0 lead.

The Warriors answered in the bottom of the third inning, cutting Northville's lead to 2-1 on an RBI single with two outs by senior Owen Turner, one of several Rice standouts.

But that ended up being all the scoring.

In the fourth inning, Brother Rice loaded the bases with two outs, but Northville senior reliever **Caden Besco** (left) ended the threat by inducing a flyout to left field. Besco then threw a scoreless fifth inning before Brother Rice put on the leadoff man in the sixth following an error. Besco helped his own cause by snaring a line drive and doubling up the runner on first.

He then slammed the door following a two-out single in the seventh, striking out Rice's No. 2 hitter to start the Northville celebration.

Flint Powers Catholic 11, Spring Lake 0

On behalf of the 2024 Flint Powers Catholic baseball team, the message was loud and clear to past players, alumni and school officials: We finally did it for Tom.

Tom would be longtime head coach Tom Dutkowski, who after 42 years and 872 wins finally got to coach in a state championship game.

Not only did Powers get there for Dutkowski, but the Chargers delivered win No. 873 and his long-awaited first title as coach with an 11-0 defeat of Spring Lake in the Division 2 Final at McLane Stadium.

"We just made Flint Powers history, and to be a part of that is amazing," Powers senior **Fischer Hendershot** (right) said.

It was the third title for Powers baseball, joining the 1974 and 1980 championships. Dutkowski was an assistant on the 1980 team.

"I played in '73 here, and my joke for that was that I taught the '74 guys everything they knew and then they won a state championship the next year," Dutkowski said.

Powers (37-6) wasted no time against Spring Lake, taking a 2-0 lead with one out in the top of the first inning on a two-run double to the gap in left-center by Gavin Darling. After a ground out, Darling scored on a Spring Lake throwing error to give Powers a 3-0 lead.

Powers added another run in the second inning on a bases-loaded walk to make it 4-0.

Powers scored four runs to take an 8-0 lead on an RBI single by Hendershot, a walk with the bases loaded and a two-run single by freshman Connor Kelly.

Powers then put three more runs on the board in the fourth inning to take an 11-0 lead.

Hendershot was the winner on the mound, allowing two hits and striking out five in five innings of work.



Beal City 10, Norway 0

Getting to pitch in a state championship game once is rare in itself. Doing so twice is even more improbable. But three times during a career? Take a bow, Beal City senior Cayden Smith. In 2022, Smith pitched two innings of relief in a loss to Riverview Gabriel Richard. In 2023, he allowed one run in a complete-game win over Plymouth Christian Academy.

Getting the ball again in a championship game last June, Smith saved the best for his last high school game and achieved something no pitcher had done before in a Final, throwing a perfect game in a 10-0 Beal City win over Norway that ended after five innings.

Smith struck out eight batters to earn his second-straight Finals win.

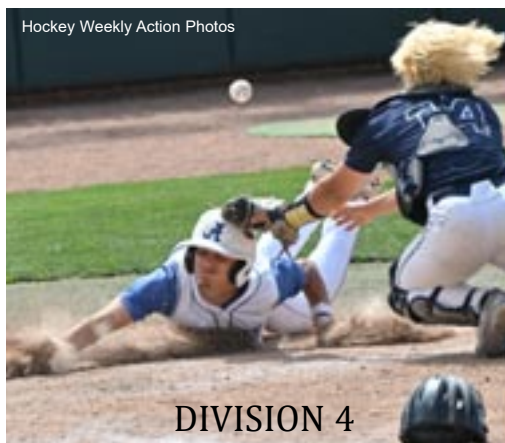
Beal City's offense was also potent, starting when senior **Jack Fussman** (sliding, left) singled home Smith for the first run in the bottom of the first inning.

Beal City (34-6) then grabbed a 2-0 lead in the second on an RBI single with two outs by junior Owen McKenny.

The Aggies kept the pressure on in the third, scoring four times to take a 6-0 lead. Senior Lane Gross hit a two-run double to the gap in right-center, and then Smith helped his own cause with a two-run double that made it 5-0 Beal City. A walk with the bases loaded gave the Aggies a 6-0 advantage.

In the fifth inning, Beal City took an 8-0 lead on a two-run single by Fussman, and then completed the game via the run-differential rule when a single up the middle by senior Josh Wilson ended up scoring two runs with a Norway throwing error to home.

Fussman finished with four RBI for Beal City, which won its sixth Finals title in school history.

One Hit for History

Evart Needed Just One Hit and Brilliant Pitching for First Title in Any Sport

Evart flexed its muscles during the 2024 MHSAA Softball Semifinals, smacking three over-the-fence home runs out of MSU's Secchia Stadium.

In the Division 3 Final, the Wildcats managed only one single the entire game – which turned out to be just enough to bring home the first team championship in school history in any sport.

Sophomore ace Kyrrah Gray threw a shutout, and her sophomore classmate Mattisen Tiedt delivered her team's only hit in the bottom of the sixth inning – a run-scoring shot to right field to bring home Allyson Theunick – lifting Evart to a 1-0 victory over hard-luck Ottawa Lake Whiteford.

"You could tell it was going to come down to one hit, and I still can't believe that it was me," said Tiedt, a first baseman who bats fourth in the lineup.

The Bobcats never gave up, using singles from Kaydence Sheldon and Koralynn Billau to put runners on second and third base with just one out in the top of the seventh inning. But Gray showed her grit, digging deep and striking out the next two batters to preserve the win.

Gray threw a five-hitter with 12 strikeouts in a classic pitchers' duel against Whiteford senior Unity Nelson, who surrendered just the one hit and struck out eight.

"We won ugly," said first-year Wildcats coach Shaun Gray, a 1998 Evart graduate and Kyrrah's father. "We have won ugly at times this year and, at other times, we showed off our bats. We'll take it however we can get it."

The win atoned for a heartbreaking Finals loss two years earlier for Evart, which fell to Millington, 3-2, in eight innings.

The 2024 game appeared headed for extra innings as both Gray and Nelson refused to give an inch.

Evart (37-4) finally got something going in the sixth inning when Theunick got hit by a pitch and stole second. That runner in scoring position brought the Evart fans, led by a loud and enthusiastic student section, to their feet.

After the next batter, slugger Katelyn Gostlin, fouled off several pitches before finally popping out to the shortstop, Coach Gray knew a breakthrough was near.

"Unity is such a great pitcher, but we were starting to get our timing down on her," said Gray, who is assisted by Kevin Brigham. "I called a timeout and told Matty (Tiedt) that there was no one I would rather have batting right then than her. Then she got in there and came through."

Whiteford (30-6-1) lost in Finals three consecutive years, including now nearly identical 1-0 losses the past two.

In both of those games, Nelson dominated in the circle, only to see the opposition – Standish-Sterling in 2023 and Evart now – come through with one timely hit.

"Unity is one of the most inspirational players ever at Whiteford," said fifth-year Bobcats coach Matt VanBrandt. "She keeps us in every game and, most of the time, we can do enough to win. Just not today."

"But we played six games in Secchia Stadium in the last three years, which is pretty impressive."

Sheldon and Billau both had two hits for Whiteford.

Nelson finished her senior season with a 19-3 record and 287 strikeouts.

Part of the reason Whiteford was not able to break through was the clutch pitching of Gray with runners on base. The sophomore came of age on the state's biggest softball stage, also striking out the final two batters during the second inning after Whiteford put two runners on, just like her finish to the seventh.

She smiled when told that gave her dad a special Father's Day gift one day early.

"My whole focus this weekend was just to pitch my game and not get overwhelmed by all of this," Gray said. "We knew it would be a dogfight, and we had to keep fighting to get one. We finally got it."

Freshman Lauren Luchies followed with an RBI single to make it 3-0.

"As the leadoff batter, that's my goal," Beemer said. "To get on in the first inning because that sets the tone for the rest of the seven innings."

Snip, a lefty, felt more relaxed after getting the early run support.

"To get three runs on the board early made me not so nervous anymore, because at the beginning I was really nervous," said Snip, who had eight strikeouts. "My nerves went away after the three runs because my offense had me, and my defense always has my back."

Lake Orion pitcher Rylee Limberger had her team's only hit off Snip, but a double play by Hudsonville ended any threat.

Gaylord 3, Vicksburg 2 (8 inn)

Gaylord junior pitcher Aubrey Jones was given a second opportunity to close out the 2024 Division 2 championship game and help her team repeat. She had her older sister Jayden Jones to thank for it.

Jayden helped bring home the go-ahead run in the top of the eighth inning to give Gaylord a dramatic 3-2 win over Vicksburg at Secchia Stadium.

Vicksburg had evened the score in the bottom of the seventh inning, extending the game. But after Gaylord retook the lead, Aubrey Jones retook the pitching circle and shut the door with a 1-2-3 bottom of the eighth.

It was a rematch of the 2023 Division 2 Final, but this ending was much different as Vicksburg rallied to tie it in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Down to their last strike in the seventh inning, Vicksburg delivered a stunning comeback.

Back-to-back singles with two outs by Maddison Diekman and Emily Zemitans and a Gaylord error evened the score at 2-2 and sent the game to extra innings.

In the top of the eighth inning, **Alexis Shepherd** (right) singled with one out and then Jayden Jones knocked a single to right field. Shepherd raced home on a throwing error at third base, and the Blue Devils retook the lead.

Aubrey Jones then got a pair of flyouts with a strikeout in between to end the game. She finished with five strikeouts and allowed just one walk over eight innings.

Gaylord (38-4) took an early 2-0 lead with runs in each of the first two innings before Vicksburg trimmed the deficit in the bottom of the second with an RBI double from Ella Luegge.

Unionville-Sebewaing 11, Holton 1

Leave it to standout senior catcher **Gabby Crumm** (1, left) to ensure her school's spot in the state record books.

Unionville-Sebewaing was doing its thing in the 2024 Division 4 championship game, slowly pulling away from first-time finalist Holton – until Crumm stepped up to the plate in the fourth inning.

Crumm launched one of her signature shots over the centerfield wall, a two-run homer that keyed a six-run inning for the Patriots, who then cruised to an 11-1 victory in six innings at Secchia Stadium.

It was USA's fifth straight Finals championship, dating back to pre-COVID in 2019, and tying the record for consecutive titles with Kalamazoo Christian, which won five Division 3 titles in a row from 1996 to 2000.

"It's really bittersweet right now," said Crumm, a four-year starter at catcher. "USA softball has meant everything to me, and it's shaped me in so many ways. I'm sad that it's over, but it couldn't have ended in a better way."

USA, which finished 31-11 and was the top-ranked team in Division 4 entering the postseason, showed its experience in the first inning – getting girls on base and putting the pressure on Holton using two hits and two errors to jump out to a 3-0 lead.

The lead would stay that way until the fourth inning, when USA's tremendous senior class stepped up and put the game away.

Shortstop Ella Neumann ripped a two-run single, which led the Red Devils to change pitchers. Crumm followed up right after Neumann with her long blast over the centerfield wall to effectively put the game out of reach.

Holton (29-13-1), playing in its first softball championship game managed just three hits against Patriots sophomore Olivia Greene.

Sportsmanship Extends to Online Behavior

With the changes that have occurred in college sports the past couple of years, high school sports is truly the last level of pure amateur competition in our country – and the NFHS and its member state associations want it to remain that way.

As football, volleyball, soccer, cross country and other sports begin this fall, high school coaches and athletic/activity directors will be involved in preseason meetings to emphasize the expected outcomes of education-based sports, as well as speech, debate, music, theatre and other programs.

Among those fundamental values of education-based activities that must be discussed is sportsmanship, or good sporting behavior. More than winning, more than learning the skills of a sport, a focus on sportsmanship has been one of the defining elements of high school sports and other activities for more than 100 years.

Along with maintaining the sound traditions of sports and minimizing the risk of injury, NFHS playing rules encourage sportsmanship, and the first page in all NFHS rules publications includes a statement noting that “each athlete is responsible for exercising caution and good sportsmanship.”

In the past, with an emphasis on conduct on the playing field or court – or in the auditorium or rehearsal hall – sportsmanship has been defined as those qualities of behavior that are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. More so than preparing students to play sports or another activity at the next level, one of the significant goals of education-based high school sports and activities is helping the 12 million-plus individuals in these programs to become responsible citizens.

And in today’s online world dominated by hand-held devices, that goal has become more challenging. Now, messages to students in high school sports and other activities about sportsmanship must be communicated before they hit the practice field or court because one inappropriate post, tweet or message could alter their lives forever.

At the recent virtual National Student Leadership Summit hosted by the NFHS, Christina Jontra of Neptune Navigate, one of the newest NFHS corporate partners, discussed the need for good sportsmanship online as much or more so than on the court or field.

In the digital age in which we live, participants in high school activity programs need to be aware that their character and respect for others should be the same, whether in the sport or activity itself, or online.

As the popularity and influence of social media continues to surge, it is imperative that student-athletes, as well as coaches, administrators, parents and everyone involved in education-based athletics, are aware of the ways they can endanger themselves with their online behavior and understand the techniques they can employ to prevent that from happening.

In her recent presentation, Jontra noted five characteristics of good sportsmanship online – honesty, compassion, respect, responsibility and courage. Just as a student would respect an opponent on the field or in the debate room, the same must occur online.

At preseason meetings this fall, coaches and athletic/activity directors should encourage students in their programs to be mindful of online contact with individuals on opposing teams – particularly any bantering that could be perceived as cyberbullying. As Jontra mentioned in her message during the NSLS, hurtful words can ruin a person’s life forever.

Fortunately, during the season, the millions of high school students involved in sports and performing arts have less free time to spend online on a daily basis, but the time spent must be done in a positive manner. Not only could damaging words on social media affect a student’s chances for an athletic scholarship, inappropriate messages could also negatively impact future job possibilities as employers are more actively auditing social media.

Whether the setting is before hundreds of people at an actual game or event, or a private experience alone online, positive and respectful behavior should be the choice every time.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2025

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 36 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2024-25 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2025-26 school year. This year, a total of 1,513 applications from 431 schools were received for 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients were honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing in March.

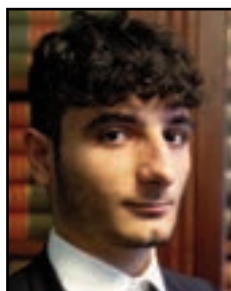

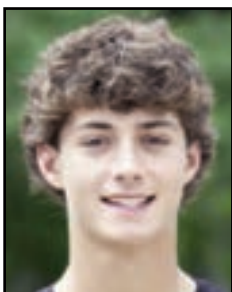

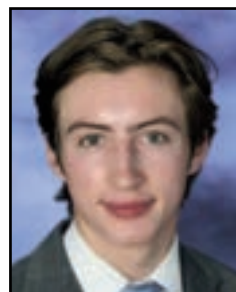

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2025-26 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2025-26 are: **Nichole James**, Detroit Edison; **Mia McGregor**, Mio; **Camryn Siegers**, Holland Christian; **Lucy Weber**, Fenton; **Brody Hammer**, Middleville Thornapple-Kellogg; **Sam Bentley**, Ypsilanti Lincoln; **Mason Mireles**, Hartford; and **Joey Smokevitch**, Johannesburg-Lewiston.

Those eight new members were selected from 125 applicants, the second largest group of applicants in the 20 years of the council. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 148 schools from 53 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 11 MHSAA sports, and six will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets eight times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council handed out championship trophies at Finals events, led sessions during four Sportsmanship Summits, provided feedback to the MHSAA Representative Council

MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

MICHIGAN ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP



Michigan high school seniors and students who recently graduated from high school may be eligible for the Michigan Achievement Scholarship.

Community College Guarantee

All students are eligible for the Community College Guarantee (regardless of family income), which includes:

- Earning a skills certificate or associate degree tuition-free at their in-district community college!*
- An additional \$1,000 Michigan Achievement Bonus for Pell-eligible students to use toward additional college costs.

Public or Private University

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a Public or Private University.

- Up to \$27,500 to earn a bachelor's degree—that's \$5,500 per year for up to five years.
- 7 in 10 high school graduates are eligible.
- Find out if you are eligible by completing the FAFSA.

Career Training

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a career training program.

- Up to \$4,000 to earn a skill certificate—that's \$2,000 per year for up to two years.
