**T**he last high school softball game of the 2025 season was played by Grass Lake and Clare, and fittingly the old adage “saving the best for last” applied in what was a thrilling finish between two teams making their first championship game appearances.

Grass Lake ultimately got to celebrate its first title by holding off Clare for a 5-4 win in the Division 3 Final. But it was the seventh inning that had the overflow crowd buzzing, even long after the final out was made.

Clare entered the top of the seventh up 2-1 after scoring a run in the sixth, and Grass Lake had its 7-8-9 hitters coming up.

But Grass Lake head coach Roger Cook wasn't worried.

“It seems like the bottom of order has been coming through quite a bit,” Cook said. “One through nine, we're comfortable with the next person.”

Sure enough, freshman Kennedy Collins walked, sophomore Reese Late reached on a bunt single and junior Addalynn Hensen walked to load the bases for the top of the order.

Grass Lake then tied the game at 2-2 when Collins beat a throw to the plate on a ground ball hit to second base.

With the bases still loaded and nobody out, Grass Lake took a 4-2 lead on an infield error, which scored two runs. Grass Lake then went up 5-2 on a sacrifice fly by senior Bree Salts.

Then, it was Clare's turn to mount a comeback.

In the bottom of the inning, senior Addison McMillan tripled and scored on a single by senior Tessa Kelly to make it 5-3. With two outs, Clare cut the Grass Lake lead to 5-4 on an RBI double by sophomore Breez Yarger.

The Pioneers eventually had a runner on first and third base with two out, but Grass Lake junior pitcher Morgan Conrad ended the game by inducing a flyout.

Whew. What an ending.

“I was definitely nervous, but over the years I've learned how to handle those nerves,” said Salts, one of the team's seniors and catcher. “So I just knew this was the only place in the world I wanted to be in this moment.”

An alum and current teacher at Grass Lake who is in his 24th year as head coach, Cook said he walks by pictures in the school of past Finals championship and runner-up teams.

“I've been doing this for 25 years, and I've been thinking, ‘Gosh, just one time for us to get up there,’” Cook said. “Today is the day.”

Much like it did during its Semifinal win, Clare scored in the bottom of the sixth inning to grab a 2-1 lead.

With runners on first and second and one out, senior catcher Savannah Buzzelli hit a hard ground ball that deflected off the pitcher and went to the left side of the infield. That gave enough time for pinch runner Sophia Buzzelli to score from second base and put Clare ahead.

Grass Lake opened the scoring in the third inning, grabbing a 1-0 lead on an RBI single by Salts. Clare tied the game at 1-1 in the fourth inning when a run scored on a wild pitch.

“We got the ground balls we wanted, we just didn't capitalize,” Clare head coach Shane Kelly said. “We were in that situation against Gladstone (in a Quarterfinal), got a double play and got out of it. I every bit thought we were going to do the same thing. We just didn't capitalize.”

### Saline 5, South Lyon 2

The head coach hadn't coached high school softball before 2024, the ace pitcher had never played on varsity before 2025, and the program itself had never advanced beyond the MHSAA Quarterfinal round over its long history.

But, coach Rebecca Suiter, junior pitcher **Abby Curtis** (left), and the rest of the team made history with a 5-2 win over South Lyon for the school's first title.

Curtis went 20-0 and finished an incredible year by throwing a seven-hitter against South Lyon, striking out 13 and walking none.

Coming off a 5-4 win over 2024 champion Hudsonville in the Semifinal — a win that featured a 2-run rally in the top of the seventh inning — Saline's offense was consistent throughout the championship game. The Hornets collected 10 hits and scored single runs in every inning except the fourth and the seventh.

Senior Ava Stripp broke a 1-1 tie in the second with a solo home run, and the Hornets took a 3-1 lead in the third inning on an RBI groundout by sophomore Gracelyn Waldrop. It was her second RBI of the day after she singled home the game's first run.

In the fifth inning, Saline went up 4-1 on an RBI single with two outs by junior Madison Bellus. Saline got its final run in the sixth on an RBI double to the gap in left-center by Casey Griffin.

South Lyon scored a single run in the sixth inning on an RBI single by junior Ella Glowacki to make it 5-2, but couldn't get closer.

South Lyon also scored in the first inning on an RBI fielder's choice off the bat of sophomore Isabella Bracali. South Lyon (33-8) also had a new coach in Jerry Shippe and was unranked heading into the MHSAA Tournament, but went on an unforgettable run to reach championship weekend.

### Richmond 3, Paw Paw 0

Spending her entire life in the Richmond community, **Katie Shuboy** (right) can pinpoint exactly when she wanted to become part of the tradition-rich softball program at the high school.

"I've always gone to Richmond schools, and I remember watching my cousin (Erin Shuboy) win a state championship (in 2016) and watching the 2021 team win it," Shuboy said. "I knew I wanted to do that one day."

That one day turned out to be last June, as Shuboy helped guide Richmond to its third Finals title with a 3-0 victory over Paw Paw in the Division 2 championship game.

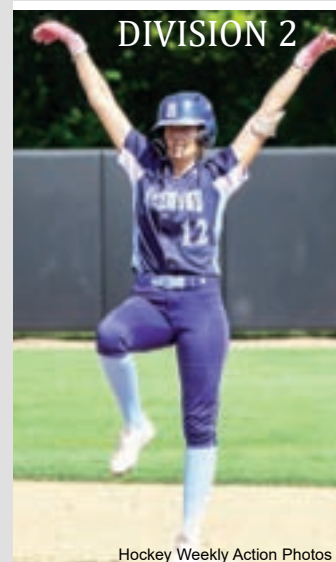
The senior pitcher tossed her second 1-hit shutout of Finals weekend, striking out 12 and walking two. It was also her third-straight shutout to end the season after a 6-0 win over Goodrich in a Quarterfinal and a 2-0 blanking of Escanaba during the Semifinals.

Paw Paw entered the game with one of the state's most potent offenses, with five players batting .434 or higher. Shuboy and her coaches went over scouting reports and tendencies of Paw Paw's hitters, but the plan was pretty much doing what she has all year.

"You can only overthink it so much," Shuboy said. "You just really have to go out and do what you normally do."

Richmond scored two runs in the bottom of the first inning. After hitting a leadoff triple to left field, freshman Kendall Nader scored on an RBI bunt single by junior Audrina Nader. Following a double by Shuboy that put runners on second and third, junior Anna McKiernan scored Nader with an RBI infield single to make it 2-0 Blue Devils.

The game remained that way until Richmond got some insurance in the bottom of the sixth inning on an RBI single by junior Emma Bambrick that made it a 3-0 game.

### Mendon 11, Unionville-Sebewaing 1

Mendon wasn't going to be denied this time – and in the process, the Hornets denied Michigan's most record-setting softball program from adding another detail to its dominance over the last half-decade.

Seeking its record sixth-straight Finals championship, Unionville-Sebewaing was dethroned by a talented, motivated and determined Mendon team, which won its first championship with an 11-1 victory in the 2025 Division 4 Final at Secchia Stadium.

The game ended with two outs in the bottom of the sixth inning after Mendon's 11th run scored on a throwing error by USA.

In short, Mendon (35-2) did to USA what USA (20-16) has been able to do so often during its stretch of dominance.

The Hornets also avenged one-run defeats to USA in the championship game (5-4) two years earlier (5-4) and Semifinals (6-5) in 2024.

Mendon started its onslaught by scoring four runs with two outs in the bottom of the first inning.

With the bases loaded, an infield popup by senior Ally Butler eluded two USA infielders and fell to the ground, allowing two runs to score.

The Hornets' Gracie Schultz extends to snag a line drive in left field. Junior Cienna Nightingale then hit a 2-run double to give the Hornets a 4-0 lead.

Mendon got four more runs in the third, first when Nightingale hit another 2-run double just beyond the glove of the left fielder. Seniors Elise Allen and Abby Butler each followed with RBI doubles to put Mendon ahead 8-0.

**T**he Hartland baseball team had been accustomed to playing in close games throughout the MHSAA Tournament. So when the 2025 Division 1 Final against Macomb Dakota went to extra innings, the Eagles weren't fazed by the moment.

Hartland pulled out a dramatic 5-3 victory in nine innings in a game that lasted nearly three hours.

The Eagles clinched their first Finals title since 2015 by scoring two runs in the top of the ninth.

Hartland won four straight games by one run during this play-off run and also won by two runs in the Semifinal against Grosse Pointe South.

"The close games definitely helped us with our mindset," said junior Logan Randall, who pitched the final four innings and allowed only one earned run and two hits.

"Whenever times came tough during this game, we all knew what to do because we've been used to it. It's happened five games in a row. We adapted and knew that anything could happen. Every playoff game had been back and forth, and we knew we could come out on top if we gave it our all."

Hartland coach Brad Guenther said his team wasn't always good at eking out the tight ones during the season.

"I'm super proud of them, but it's something that wasn't our strength through the middle of the year," he said. "We lost a lot of close games with a lot of new guys playing, but being in tough spots where we had to get out of jams kind of put us on this run and catapulted us."

"We gave up eight runs in seven games, and there were a lot of jams that they were in so we had to be good in those moments. We failed a lot in those moments too, but we were able to respond and execute when we needed to."

Hartland (28-15-1) trailed 2-0 after the first inning, but rallied to tie it in the third.

In the top of the ninth, senior Michael Zielinski laced a single

to right field that was misplayed and allowed the go-ahead run to score.

"I was just trying to do my job," Zielinski said. "I was expecting to go up there and lay a bunt down, but he let me swing away and I was seeing the ball well all day. I got the barrel to it and hit it to right field, and the guy made a little mistake and we capitalized on it."

Senior Roman Forcia followed with a sacrifice fly to give the Eagles a two-run lead.

"We knew they were a good team, and we knew they were going to come out strong and they did," Zielinski said. "We had faith in each other, and everyone in that dugout knew we were going to find a way and we did."

Both teams had opportunities to score in the sixth inning, but the score remained tied after both teams came up empty.

Hartland took a brief lead in the top of the eighth on a sacrifice fly by Randall, but the Cougars responded in the bottom of the inning with an RBI single from Jadon Ford to even it at 3-3.

"It's pretty surreal right now," Guenther said. "A lot of guys in our dugout were probably the only ones who really thought we had a chance to make a run and we could win these games like this. We were not the favorites along the way, but coming together and doing something special like that - these guys will never forget that."

Top-ranked Dakota (36-7-1), which was searching for its first Finals championship, was plagued by missed opportunities and four errors.

"Both teams kept fighting, and both teams played hard," Cougars coach Angelo Plouffe said. "They got a few more hits and we made a few more mistakes than they did, and it's the name of the game right there."

"I think they deserved it. They did it when they needed to and we didn't, but I'm very proud of my guys and all my seniors because they got us here."

### Forest Hills Eastern 5, Standish-Sterling 2

The Ada Forest Hills Eastern baseball team didn't panic when it fell behind by two runs in the 2025 Division 2 Final.

The Hawks simply did what they've done all season – they responded. FHE overcame the early deficit and emerged with a 5-2 win over Standish-Sterling at McLane Stadium.

"Respond has been our word this year, and we've lived by that," said Hawks senior **Max Ferrick** (left), who went 2-for-3 with two RBIs and a run scored.

"Any time we get down, we're like, 'All right, it's time to respond, it's time to get back and do our thing.' We know we're better, we just have to do it."

The top-ranked Hawks (42-1) captured their second Final in four years, also winning in 2022.

They also ended this season on an incredible 41-game winning streak.

Second-ranked Standish-Sterling, playing in its first Final, tallied a pair of runs in the first inning to snag a 2-0 lead.

However, the Hawks countered with five unanswered runs the remainder of the game.

FHE scored once in the bottom of the first inning on an RBI single from James Dempsey and three times in the third inning to grab its first lead.

Ferrick roped a shot to the gap for a double that tied it 2-2. Then a throwing error by the Panthers allowed two more runs to score to put the Hawks ahead 4-2.

Ferrick added a two-out double in the fourth inning.

FHE junior Colton Brinks was brilliant in relief of starter Landen Lindley.

Brinks allowed only two hits in 4  $\frac{2}{3}$  innings pitched and struck out the final three batters in the top of the seventh after walking the lead-off hitter.

### Traverse City St Francis 5, Marine City 4

Traverse City St. Francis senior Charlie Olivier threw up three fingers before heading to the outfield in the seventh inning of the 2025 Division 3 Final.

It signified more than the three outs the Gladiators would eventually get to accomplish a feat that hadn't occurred in 35 years.

Appearing in a Division 3 Final for the third time over the last eight years, the Gladiators (31-8-1) overcame a late rally by the Mariners to hang on and win their first championship since 1990 (in Class D), 5-4.

"Winning a state title in baseball is so hard, and there are so many things that can happen to lose one baseball game – and not always does the best team win," said St. Francis coach Tom Passinault, who's been coaching high school baseball and football since 1993.

The Gladiators struck first in the opening inning when junior Matthew Kane ripped an RBI single to score junior **Tyler Thompson** (right), who led off the game with a single.

St. Francis added to its lead with a three-run third inning. Kane delivered another RBI single to make it 2-0, and then Olivier followed with a suicide squeeze to score Sam Wildfong. After a pitching change, Braxton Lesinski knocked an RBI single past a drawn-in infield with the bases loaded and St. Francis held a 4-0 advantage.

Harrison Shepherd's sacrifice fly in the fourth inning scored Thompson to give St. Francis a 5-0 cushion, but Marine City didn't go away quietly.

The Mariners, playing in their first Final, scored four runs with two outs in the bottom of the inning, courtesy of a hit batsman, a wild pitch and a throwing error.

### Portland St Patrick 10, Plymouth Christian Academy 0

Portland St. Patrick flourished at all three aspects of the game during the final baseball championship matchup of the 2025 MHSAA season.

And the top-ranked Shamrocks left little doubt which team was the best in Division 4.

Timely hitting, stellar pitching and superb defense propelled them to a convincing 10-0 win over Plymouth Christian Academy in five innings at McLane Stadium.

"It was a little surreal, like it didn't feel real at that moment when we did win it," said St. Patrick pitcher Brayden Simon, who tossed a one-hitter with two strikeouts and one walk allowed. "We've been dreaming about this since the first practice in the spring, and this is what we wanted since the beginning."

The Shamrocks finished with a 34-1 overall record and their only loss coming against No. 2 Mount Pleasant Sacred Heart.

The final game was a culmination of hard work and commitment to secure the program's first Finals title since 2017. The top-ranked Shamrocks scored at least one run in every inning and kept the Cougars off the scoreboard with an array of defensive plays.

The Shamrocks stormed out to an early 3-0 advantage with three runs in the first inning and tacked on three more over the next two innings.

They added a pair of runs in the fourth inning to increase their lead to 8-0.

Sophomore Jerryd Scheurer, junior Charlie Thelen and Tyler Thelen combined for six of the Shamrocks' 10 hits. Charlie Thelen had two RBIs and two runs scored.

The Eagles (29-8) finished runners-up for the second time in three years. They lost to Beal City in the 2023 Final.

# Growing is the Purpose: Education First

**H**igh school sports is experiencing record participation. It is also experiencing unprecedented pressure.

Across the country, young athletes are training earlier, competing year-round and navigating expectations shaped by a rapidly expanding youth sports economy. For many families, athletics now feel like increasingly high stakes.

High school sports operate differently—by design. They exist within schools, alongside classrooms, guided by the same educational mission. Participation is structured to support academic success and to teach intangibles like discipline, teamwork, resilience and responsibility. Rules around eligibility, seasons and competition are not barriers to ambition; they are safeguards for students.

As expectations around winning and advancement continue to rise, the NFHS believes it is worth reaffirming the role that high school athletics play in education—and why that purpose matters.

Every high school athlete is a student first, and we see high school sports as a vital extension of the classroom. In “the last class of the day,” student-athletes develop character and integrity and learn life lessons they will carry with them long after their playing days are over.

Today’s high school student-athletes will be tomorrow’s leaders. So, while the goal of playing high school sports is to win, the true purpose is much greater—for students to learn and grow as people.

How? By keeping high school sports educational, competitively balanced and accessible for all students. Why? To ensure high school sports develop the whole person, not just the athlete.

Last summer, the New York Times published an article stating youth sports is now a \$40 billion industry. Private lessons, club sports, travel teams and elite competitions are costly and wildly popular.

For many student-athletes, their sports experience is focused on becoming an elite athlete and landing a college scholarship.

**But according to the NCAA, of the 8.2 million high school student-athletes in the United States (an all-time record), only 7% go on to play in college, and only 2% earn any type of scholarship.**

Further, data from College Board’s “Trends in College Pricing and Student Aid 2025” report shows that **the total published cost of attendance (tuition, fees, room and**

**board) at four-year colleges now averages roughly \$31,000 per year in-state and more than \$50,000 per year out-of-state—**underscoring why families feel intense pressure to secure athletic scholarships.

That’s why the purpose of high school sports must be so much more than winning, earning trophies or advancing to the next level.

Only a select few go on to play in college and even fewer get scholarships. But nearly all student-athletes benefit from participating in high school sports. They experience personal growth. They learn leadership skills. They build community and more. When athletics are education-based, students’ long-term development and well-being remain the top priority above all else.

With the guiding principle of students first, the NFHS and state high school associations across the country are committed to preserving the integrity, opportunity and educational alignment of high school sports for all student-athletes.

The purpose of high school sports—helping students learn and grow as people—is what we are here to protect and preserve for generations to come. And it is our honor to do so.

# Scholar-Athlete Class of 2026

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 37 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2025-26 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2026-27 school year. This year, a total of 1,438 applications from 426 schools were received for 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients were honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing in March.

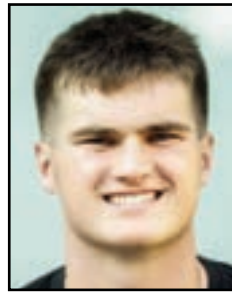

# Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

**S**ixteen junior and senior student-athletes during the 2025-26 academic year are serving on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. This year's juniors joined the group of eight seniors appointed a year ago.

Completing their first years on the Student Advisory Council in 2025-26 are: **Nichole James**, Detroit Edison; **Mia McGregor**, Mio; **Camryn Siegers**, Holland Christian; **Lucy Weber**, Fenton; **Brody Hammer**, Middleville Thornapple-Kellogg; **Sam Bentley**, Ypsilanti Lincoln; **Mason Mireles**, Hartford; and **Joey Smokevitch**, Johannesburg-Lewiston.

Those eight members were selected from 125 applicants, the second largest group of applicants in the 20 years of the council. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 148 schools from 53 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 11 MHSAA sports, and six will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets eight times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council handed out championship trophies at Finals events, led sessions during four Sportsmanship

Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

- 7 in 10 high school graduates are eligible.

## Career Training

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a career training program.

- Up to \$4,000 to earn a skill certificate—that's \$2,000 per year for up to two years.

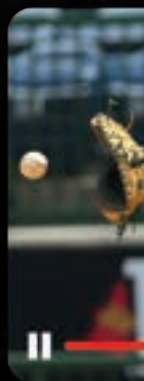
