

Final Season Records — Grandville Calvin Christian 22-8, Three Oaks-River Valley 39-4.

FINAL GAME NOTES — Three Oaks-River Valley scored early, then often, running past Grandville Calvin Christian 17-3 in the MHSAA Class C Baseball championship. River Valley, finishing with a 39-4 record in winning its first title, was a scoring machine in the two-day championship series. The Mustangs accounted for 31 runs and 33 hits in the semifinal and championship games. The 17 runs in the finale set a new Class C final game record, and tied the all-class mark originally set by Mt. Clemens Clintondale in 1988. The 14 hits by the winners also set a Class C final game record. River Valley jumped out to a 7-0 lead after two innings, then closed its scoring with a pair of five-run frames in the fifth and sixth. Rightfielder McCarty and hird baseman Schueneman led the Mustang attack, combining for seven runs batted in and six hits. McCarty's four RBIs tied a Class C final game record, and Schueneman's four runs scored set a C mark and tied an all-class record for the finals. Senior outfielder Vis led Calvin Christian's eight-hit attack with two singles and two runs batted in. Calvin Christian, the 1994 Class C champion, finishes the season with a 22-8 record.

Final Season Records — Hillman 29-6, New Buffalo 24-6.

FINAL GAME NOTES — Hillman's bid to repeat as a MHSAA Class D baseball champion ran into a New Buffalo roadblock. A seven-run second inning by the Bison lifted the Berrien County club to a 10-4 championship win over the Tigers. Hillman had a 3-1 lead after the first inning, but the 24-6 Bisons delivered with four hits, three walks, an error and a wild pitch as part of its seven-run second frame. The 29-6 Tigers narrowed the margin to 8-4 after five and a half innings. New Buffalo plated a pair of insurance runs in the bottom of the sixth, then choked off any hope of a Hillman rally in the seventh when Yettaw tallied his seventh strikeout to strand a pair of Tiger runners. In addition to his pitching, the junior had two of New Buffalo's 11 hits. The Bison had 30 hits in the two-day championship round, bashing out 19 in a semifinal game against Waterford Our Lady of the Lakes. Arvan had three hits for the winners, along with a pair of runs bated in. Lucas Shepherd had two of Hillman's eight hits. The title is New Buffalo's second for baseball in Class D, and the other coming 1983. Hillman was playing the in title game for the third time in four years.
