# Belleville Power Pair Leads Way

It's no secret. The Belleville girls basketball team is certainly going to savour this moment.

Behind the superb play of sophomore Sydney Savoury and junior Se'Crette Carter, the Tigers claimed the program's first Division 1 Finals championship last March with a 61-48 win over Rockford at Breslin Center.

Savoury scored a team-high 22 points, while Carter made four 3-pointers and finished with 12 points.

"We knew today that we could make history, and we were super excited to get out there and play," said Savoury, who added five rebounds, three assists and three steals.

"It means everything, and it's about legacy. We played our hardest and played for Belleville."

Belleville reached the Semifinals for the first time in 2024, falling to Grand Blanc, but returned four starters.

"It feels amazing to be one of the great teams now," Carter said. "Rockford is a great team with great players, but we want-



ed it more. You could tell we had moments where we had lapses, but our perseverance and passion pushed through."

The Tigers (28-1) held a slim 18-14 lead after the first quarter, but back-to-back 3-pointers from Savoury and Carter gave the Tigers a 24-16 lead midway through the second.

Belleville took a 26-20 advantage into the half and never relinquished the lead.

"I can't even believe this, honestly," Tigers head coach Jason Wilkins said. "When I first got the job at Belleville, I didn't think we would be in the position to be a top program, especially in our conference, so five years later to be a state champ is a great feeling. I'm proud of these kids. They bought into our system in the summer, and it all paid off."

Savoury opened the second half with a 3-pointer after a Rockford turnover, making it 29-20. Late in the third quarter, Belleville scored six in a row, capped by a Jaida Qinn lay-up that added to a double-digit advantage (42-29).

Carter dropped in another 3-pointer midway through the fourth quarter to increase the lead to 49-34.

While Savoury was the leading scorer, the Tigers received contributions throughout the lineup, as four players scored in double figures.

Senior Iyana Stephens was a perfect 5 of 5 from the floor and scored 12 points while grabbing eight rebounds. The only other senior, Rylan Buschell, dished out six assists. Freshman guard Paisley Stephens added 10 points and three assists.

"I was really happy that I was able to step up today," Iyana Stephens said. "It's something everybody strives for and our coach says that everyone has a role and I just played my role and was able to help my team."

This was the Rams' second appearance in the Division 1 Final in three years. They won in 2023.

"Super proud of them and the fact that we were able to get to the final game of the season." Rockford coach Brad Wilson said. "We came up a little bit short, but our three seniors are the face of our program and we wouldn't be anywhere without them."

Rockford shot a dismal 3 of 21 from behind the 3-point arc and committed 12 turnovers. But Miss Basketball Award winner Anna Wypych connected on 9 of 15 shots to score a game-high 26 points for the Rams, who finished 27-2 overall.

## DIVISION 2 Tecumseh 54, Grand Rapids West Catholic 44

Before the 2025 Division 2 Final against Grand Rapids West Catholic, the Tecumseh girls basketball team had two people for whom it was playing.

One was Bart Bartels, a beloved long-time coach in the community who died weeks before practice started.

The team also was playing for a fallen teammate. Junior Maddy VanBlack suffered a leg injury during the Semifinal win and couldn't play in the Final, which shortened the bench significantly.

"It was super hard and super emotional," Tecumseh head coach Kristy Zajac said. "They fought through, and they battled through with six players tonight."

Indeed they did, as Tecumseh captured its first Finals championship since 1974 with a 54-44 win over West Catholic.

Tecumseh finished the season 27-1, in the process making Bartels' widow (who was in attendance), VanBlack and everyone else in the community it was playing for beyond proud.

"It's a day we will remember forever," Zajac said.

Tecumseh (27-1) built an early 14-point lead, but ultimately had to hang on for dear life against hard-charging West Catholic.

The Falcons whittled their deficit down all the way to 39-38 going into the fourth quarter, but couldn't get over the hump and take the lead or tie the game.

Tecumseh moved to a 45-40 lead with 5:26 remaining after a layup by Addi Zajac.

She hit another big layup with 1:54 left to make it 49-44, and then Tecumseh got a stop and a rebound.

Alli Zajac scored 14 points, and senior Makayla Schlorf and Bullinger both had 11.

## DIVISION 3

### Ypsilanti Arbor Prep 32, Rochester Hills Lutheran NW 21

There is just something about Ypsilanti Arbor Prep and its comfort with playing low-scoring games in the MHSAA Tournament.

After winning the 2024 Division 3 championship game while scoring just 33 points, Arbor Prep didn't score more than 32 in its final four postseason games last winter.

But that mattered not, as the Gators still managed to win all of them and capture their second-straight Division 3 title and third in four years.

The latest and final triumph of the 2024-25 season was a 32-21 win over Rochester Hills Lutheran Northwest at Breslin Center.

"We're not a great offensive team, and part of that is we are playing five to six girls," Arbor Prep head coach Scott Stine said. "We slow the ball down. We take time off the clock and when you do that, you're not going to score a lot of points."

Arbor Prep (17-12) entered the MHSAA Tournament unranked and with a losing record, but that was more a byproduct of playing a schedule filled with Division 1 and 2 opponents during the regular season.

The Final against Lutheran Northwest was an offensive struggle for both teams.

Arbor Prep held a 13-10 lead at half-time but started to gain a little separation in the third quarter when senior Eliza Bush hit consecutive 3-pointers to give the Gators a 19-12 lead.

Lutheran Northwest managed to cut its deficit to 24-18 with 4:31 remaining on a basket by junior Addie Troska. But a driving layup by Angela Meggisson with 1:51 remaining gave the Gators a 28-18.

Meggisson finished with 11 points and 10 rebounds, and Bush scored 10 points for Arbor Prep.

## DIVISION 4

### Fowler 53, Ewen Trout Creek 29

Fowler's Katie Spicer recalled all season the disappointment of losing in the Division 4 Semifinals to end the prior two.

She didn't want to relive that emotion to close her final year in an Eagles uniform.

Spicer and her teammates ended 2025 on top again after downing Ewen-Trout Creek 53-29 in the Division 4 Final.

It was the third Division 4 title over the last five years for Fowler (27-2).

"That feeling of getting so close and not being able to finish, it hurts a lot," said Spicer, who led Fowler with 17 points on 5 of 9 shooting. "So we used that a lot as motivation throughout the whole year. It helped a lot."

It was another dominating performance for the Eagles, who won every MHSAA Tournament game by more than 21 points.

"These seniors have been locked in," Fowler head coach Nathan Goerge said.

Fowler forced eight turnovers during the first quarter, but led only 14-8 as Ewen-Trout Creek junior guard Emma Besonen scored all of her team's points, including burying two deep 3-pointers.

Fowler went ahead by double digits (19-8) in the second quarter when Spicer lofted a perfect pass down court to Neelah O'Rourke for a lay-in.

A driving lay-up by freshman Bree Besonen during the waning seconds of the first half closed the gap to 23-16. The Besonen sisters combined to score 14 of the Panthers' first-half points.

Fowler scored the first six points of the third quarter and outscored E-TC 19-3 during the period to push the lead to 42-19.

Senior Elizabeth Hufnagel added 10 points, five rebounds and three steals for Fowler, while Brooke Weber scored 10.

# Growing is the Purpose: Education First

**H**igh school sports is experiencing record participation. It is also experiencing unprecedented pressure.

Across the country, young athletes are training earlier, competing year-round and navigating expectations shaped by a rapidly expanding youth sports economy. For many families, athletics now feel like increasingly high stakes.

High school sports operate differently—by design. They exist within schools, alongside classrooms, guided by the same educational mission. Participation is structured to support academic success and to teach intangibles like discipline, teamwork, resilience and responsibility. Rules around eligibility, seasons and competition are not barriers to ambition; they are safeguards for students.

As expectations around winning and advancement continue to rise, the NFHS believes it is worth reaffirming the role that high school athletics play in education—and why that purpose matters.

Every high school athlete is a student first, and we see high school sports as a vital extension of the classroom. In “the last class of the day,” student-athletes develop character and integrity and learn life lessons they will carry with them long after their playing days are over.

Today’s high school student-athletes will be tomorrow’s leaders. So, while the goal of playing high school sports is to win, the true purpose is much greater—for students to learn and grow as people.

How? By keeping high school sports educational, competitively balanced and accessible for all students. Why? To ensure high school sports develop the whole person, not just the athlete.

Last summer, the New York Times published an article stating youth sports is now a \$40 billion industry. Private lessons, club sports, travel teams and elite competitions are costly and wildly popular.

For many student-athletes, their sports experience is focused on becoming an elite athlete and landing a college scholarship.

**But according to the NCAA, of the 8.2 million high school student-athletes in the United States (an all-time record), only 7% go on to play in college, and only 2% earn any type of scholarship.**

Further, data from College Board’s “Trends in College Pricing and Student Aid 2025” report shows that **the total published cost of attendance (tuition, fees, room and**

**board) at four-year colleges now averages roughly \$31,000 per year in-state and more than \$50,000 per year out-of-state—**underscoring why families feel intense pressure to secure athletic scholarships.

That’s why the purpose of high school sports must be so much more than winning, earning trophies or advancing to the next level.

Only a select few go on to play in college and even fewer get scholarships. But nearly all student-athletes benefit from participating in high school sports. They experience personal growth. They learn leadership skills. They build community and more. When athletics are education-based, students’ long-term development and well-being remain the top priority above all else.

With the guiding principle of students first, the NFHS and state high school associations across the country are committed to preserving the integrity, opportunity and educational alignment of high school sports for all student-athletes.

The purpose of high school sports—helping students learn and grow as people—is what we are here to protect and preserve for generations to come. And it is our honor to do so.

# Scholar-Athlete Class of 2026

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 37 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2025-26 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2026-27 school year. This year, a total of 1,438 applications from 426 schools were received for 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.





# Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

**E**ight student-athletes who are juniors at their schools during the 2025-26 academic year are serving two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2025-26 are: **Nichole James**, Detroit Edison; **Mia McGregor**, Mio; **Camryn Siegers**, Holland Christian; **Lucy Weber**, Fenton; **Brody Hammer**, Middleville Thornapple-Kellogg; **Sam Bentley**, Ypsilanti Lincoln; **Mason Mireles**, Hartford; and **Joey Smokevitch**, Johannesburg-Lewiston.

Those eight new members were selected from 125 applicants, the second largest group of applicants in the 20 years of the council. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 148 schools from 53 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 11 MHSAA sports, and six will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets eight times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council handed out championship trophies at Finals events, led

# MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

# McEvans Earns 2026 WISL Honor

Over nearly three decades as a coach, school and league administrator, **Anika McEvans** has worked to provide the athletic opportunities for all children that she enjoyed as an athlete herself and later as a mother of three, including two who have gone on to play collegiately.

Her work in several roles, serving multiple school districts over nearly 28 years, has benefited thousands of students. In recognition of those contributions, McEvans has been named the 40th recipient of the MHSAA's Women In Sports Leadership Award.

Each year, the Representative Council considers the achievements of women coaches, officials and athletic administrators affiliated with the MHSAA who show exemplary leadership capabilities and positive contributions to athletics. McEvans received her award during the WISL Conference Banquet, Feb. 1 at the Crowne Plaza Lansing.

Currently in the midst of her seventh school year serving in the Office of Athletics for the Detroit Public Schools Community District, she is responsible for planning and implementation of the Detroit Public School League's sports offerings for 72 elementary and middle schools in addition to her several responsibilities supporting the league's 20 high schools. McEvans came to the PSL from Southfield Public Schools, where as district director she supervised more than 100 coaches, staff and volunteers.


Before that she was a building athletic director, and prior to becoming an administrator she coached multiple sports across tenures at three schools.

"Obviously as an athlete myself, and also the mother of female athletes, my children and I both were very fortunate to have amazing coaches and administrators who elevated our sports," McEvans said. "I made it a goal of mine everywhere I go to advocate in the same way. I want any child to have what I'd want for my children."

A basketball, volleyball and softball player while a student at Detroit Renaissance, McEvans returned to high school athletics after college first as a coach, serving as head girls varsity basketball coach at Detroit Academy of Arts & Sciences, assistant boys basketball and softball coach at Renaissance, and assistant girls basketball coach at Southfield.

She served as athletic director from 2012-15 at the former Southfield High School, and as district athletic director through 2017-18 she assisted in the merger of Southfield High and Southfield-Lathrup into Southfield Arts & Technology High School for the start of the 2016-17 school year.

Also during her time at Southfield, McEvans added competitive cheer to the school's athletic offerings, and then brought the sport to the PSL after moving to the Detroit district office. Cass Tech, Martin Luther King and Renaissance high schools have added competitive cheer teams, and McEvans is hopeful two more schools will do the same over the coming year.

"Anika McEvans continues to create and expand opportunities so as many students as possible can enjoy all of the good that comes with participation in school sports," MHSAA Executive Director Mark Uyl said. "This award celebrates Anika's leadership in this way, but also the example she sets in showing what's possible when someone is driven to make a difference."

McEvans received an MHSAA Allen W. Bush Award in 2024, celebrating her work often "behind the scenes" in school sports. She was selected for a Skillman Foundation Visionary Award this past year for her work "updating and upgrading the education system in Detroit and beyond."

She has contributed her expertise to statewide athletics in many ways as well, serving on several MHSAA committees including athletic equity, junior high/middle school, scholar-athlete and as part of multiple officials and site selection committees. She also provided a key voice as part of the MHSAA Multi-Sport Task Force during the last half of the last decade and has played a leading role in providing coaches education throughout Detroit Public Schools through the MHSAA Coaches Advancement Program.

McEvans graduated from Renaissance in 1994 and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in sports management and communications from University of Michigan and a master's in business administration from the University of Detroit Mercy. She also previously served as director of business operations and then general manager for the Detroit Demolition/Detroit Danger women's professional football franchise from 2002-06 and as assistant general manager for the Motor City Mechanics minor league hockey team from 2004-06.

Her daughter Cheyenne McEvans is currently a graduate student playing her final season of college basketball at University of Nevada. # MICHIGAN ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP



Michigan high school seniors and students who recently graduated from high school may be eligible for the Michigan Achievement Scholarship.

## Community College Guarantee

**All students** are eligible for the Community College Guarantee (regardless of family income), which includes:

- Earning a skills certificate or associate degree tuition-free at their in- district community college!\*
- An additional \$1,000 Michigan Achievement Bonus for Pell-eligible students to use toward additional college costs.

## Public or Private University

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a Public or Private University.

- Up to \$27,500 to earn a bachelor's degree—that's \$5,500 per year for up to five years.
- 7 in 10 high school graduates are eligible.
- Find out if you are eligible by completing the FAFSA.

## Career Training

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a career training program.

- Up to \$4,000 to earn a skill certificate—that's \$2,000 per year for up to two years.
- Find out if your program is eligible by visiting [michigan.gov/careertraining](http://michigan.gov/careertraining).

\*Students would receive a significant tuition discount if they attend an out-of-district community college.


