Tournament Rules

MHSAA Tournament Rules will apply. Two balls are allowed in the bowling area with one ball allowed on the ball return for the five (5) bowlers at a time. All other bowling balls and bags are to be in the team's reserved ball section.

Cost

Admission

Tickets are \$7 and must be purchased online (link and details to come).

Format

Team (Friday) – All teams will bowl 8 Baker games and 2 regular games on alternating lanes, the top three teams in each Regional advancing to the Finals.

Singles (Saturday) – All singles entrants will bowl six regular games with total pins determining score. The top 10 in each Regional will advance to the MHSAA Finals.

Tiebreaker

Tiebreaker procedures for champions and final qualifier position at Regionals, and champions and final qualifier position at the Finals will be as follows:

Singles – One regular game, if still tied then a 9-10th frame roll-off repeated until the tie is broken.

Team – One Baker set (2 games), if still tied then a 6-10th frame Baker format roll-off repeated until tie is broken.

Between sessions

Following the morning session, everyone (fans, spectators and coaches) will be required to leave the facility for sanitizing. Nobody, including players and coaches, will be able to enter for the afternoon session until sanitizing is complete.

Rosters

Roster limit is 7 bowlers for the team event; each school may enter a maximum of 6 bowlers in each gender for the singles event.

Oil Pattern

The "Phantom" oil pattern will be used.

Practice Time

There will be fifteen (15) minutes of practice prior to the start.

Lane Assignments

Jason Friday, Cheboygan Athletic Director, will make the lane assignments by random draw prior to the tournament. Lane assignments will be posted at the doors and at the coaches meeting.

Practice prior to the tournament

Teams may contact **Spare Time Lanes** for practice times for open bowling. No practice is available on tournament days. A coach must monitor any practice.

Dress Code

Boys – Slacks are required. Jeans, cutoffs, shorts, sweatpants or warm-up pants will NOT be allowed. A collared shirt or a mock turtleneck shirt will be required. Absolutely, NO T-shirts will be allowed.

Girls – Slacks, shorts or skirts will be allowed. Skirts must reach the top of the knee and shorts shall be an appropriate length (no daisy dukes or holes). Jeans, cutoffs, sweatpants, warm-ups, **yoga/spandex pants will NOT be allowed.** A collared shirt or a mock turtleneck shirt will be required. Absolutely, NO T-shirts will be allowed.

Both – Neither boys or girls may wear hats, caps, or any other type of head gear. All cell phones, I-pods, CD players, MP3 players, DVD players, etc. may not be used by any competitor on the concourse during competition. Prior to competition, warm ups (jackets, sweatshirts, hoodies) must be removed and may not be used in competition.

If a violation of the MHSAA bowling dress code occurs, a warning will be given to the player and coach of the violating team. If at that time the dress code is not followed, a loss of bowling privileges and disqualification from the MHSAA Regionals or Finals will result. Coaches must also adhere to the MHSAA dress code regulations.

Coaching Restrictions

Two school coaches will be allowed in the bowlers' seating area during competition. Coaches are not allowed on the approaches. Coaching is allowed ONLY between frames. Coaches may NOT use IPADS for coaching in the bowlers' area.

Sportsmanship

Good sportsmanship for players and coaches is a must. Taunting, profanity, and intimidating conduct are not allowed. All MHSAA regulations regarding sportsmanship and disqualification penalties as stated in Regulation IV, Section 3 will be followed. Players will not be allowed on the approach to congratulate or celebrate the accomplishment of a fellow team member during bowling. Bowlers will not be allowed to enter an adjacent lane approach to celebrate or 'run-out' their delivery. Bowlers shall observe a one-lane courtesy for bowlers on adjacent lanes.

Alcohol and Tobacco

Neither alcohol nor tobacco is allowed in the bowling area during any MHSAA event.

Live Streaming

The broadcast and streaming rights of MHSAA postseason tournament events belong exclusively to the NFHS Network, Bally Sports Detroit, the MHSAA, and those media outlets which have pre-arranged to secure those rights. Teams participating in MHSAA Tournaments are prohibited from streaming live video of any portion of an event over the Internet including using social media platforms or any other method. Likewise, individual spectators are also prohibited from live streaming video through any means.
