Tournament Rules: MHSAA tournament rules will apply. Two (2) balls per bowler will be allowed in the bowling area while five (5) balls total will be allowed in the center. Players may not alter the surface of the ball or apply cleaner after competition begins. Cleaning or polishing is allowed with a dry cloth. **Be sure to print and read the Participating Schools Tournament Information to familiarize yourself with the full and complete rules of the MHSAA tournament.**

Cost

Team event: \$3 fee per game. Therefore, total cost per team for all games is \$54.

Singles event: \$18 fee per bowler that competes. If you have 6 individual bowlers, the total cost for all 6 will be \$108. If your team has less than 6 bowlers, you will adjust your singles cost accordingly.

For a full 6-person roster, the tournament cost for both Friday and Saturday would be \$54, plus \$108 for a total of \$162. If your school has a full 6-person roster for both the boys and girls teams, the total school cost would be \$324 with adjustments made if appropriate for a lesser number of singles bowlers.

Please make checks payable to MONITOR LANES. The entry fee is due the first day of the tournament and can be for team and/or individual. You will verify what your school will be competing in when you submit your roster if you have not already done so.

Admission

The cost of admission is \$7 for spectators. Digital tickets will be sold via GoFan. It is highly encouraged that tickets be purchased online IN ADVANCE at GoFan: <https://gofan.co/app/school/MI4018>

Please inform your parents and spectators in advance of the admission charge and the advanced ticket sales on GoFan to keep things moving smoothly at the gate. Similar to all MHSAA tournaments, administrators are asked to sign in and will enter without a charge.

Rosters

Many of you have already submitted rosters. For those of you who have not, team and individual rosters must be submitted to All Saints Athletic Director Jamey Bartkowiak no later than Monday, February 19th

Format

Schools may enter up to seven (7) bowlers for the team event, and six (6) bowlers for the singles event.

Friday's team event will consist of eight (8) Baker games and two (2) traditional games. After each Baker set and each full team game, teams on odd lanes will move one pair left, while teams on the even lanes will move one pair right. Standings will be posted after each double set of Baker games (Baker games 4 and 8), and again after the first full team game with the qualifying teams being announced after the conclusion of the 2nd team game.

In Saturday's single competition, each bowler will bowl a 6-game block moving one pair of lanes right after each game. Standings will be posted after singles games 2 and 4 with those qualifying and moving on to be announced at the conclusion of the 6th and final game.

Total pin count will determine the top 7 singles from each the boys and the girls, as well as the top 2 teams with those bowlers moving on to the State Finals. Division 4 State Finals will be held March 1st (team) and 2nd (singles) at Northway Lanes in Muskegon.

Practice Time

15 minutes of practice will be given prior to the start of team and singles events with 7 ½ minutes on each lane.

Lane Assignments

Lane Assignments will be drawn by random prior to the tournament and will be posted at the entrance to the center with girls and boys positioned on opposite ends of the center.

Oil Pattern

The oil pattern for both tournament dates will be the “Phantom 2” pattern.

Dress Code

Collared, ¼ zip, crew neck or V neck jerseys will be required. Hats, blue jeans, cut-offs, yoga/spandex pants, or sweatpants will NOT be allowed. Boys must wear slacks. Girls may wear slacks. However, shorts, skorts, or skirts are permitted as long as the tip of the fingertips extends past the length when standing with arms straight down to the side. Coaches must also follow the same dress code.

All cell phones and electronic devices may not be used by any competitor on the concourse during competition, this includes warm ups. Prior to competition all non-uniform clothing (jackets, sweatshirts, hoodies, etc...) must be removed and may not be worn during competition. If a violation of the MHSAA dress code/uniform rule occurs, a warning will be issued to the player and the coach of the team in violation. If at that time, the dress code is not adhered to, a loss of bowling privileges will occur resulting in disqualification for the event.

Coaching Restrictions

A maximum of two (2) coaches will be allowed in the bowlers seating area during competition. Coaches are not allowed to be on the approach. Coaching is allowed ONLY between frames. Any electronic or recording devices including, but not limited to smart phones, video cameras, etc...may not be used during competition for coaching purposes, nor can coaches have such devices in the players area.

Foul Lights

Foul lights will be turned off during competition.

Substitutions

Starting bowlers must bowl at least one frame before being substituted for. Once a substitute enters the game, he/she must finish the game. The bowler who is substituted for may return as a starter or substitute in subsequent games. The substitute must be on the roster at the start of competition.

Sportsmanship/Code of Conduct

Good sportsmanship for not only players but coaches is REQUIRED. Any evidence of lack of proper conduct, including but not limited to: profanity, taunting, throwing of equipment, intimidation, etc...will not be tolerated. All MHSAA regulations regarding sportsmanship and disqualification penalties as stated will be followed. Players may celebrate respectfully in the accomplishment of another teammate, but will not be allowed to congregate on the approach during competition. Bowlers will not be allowed to enter an adjacent approach to celebrate or “run out” their delivery. Bowlers will observe a ONE LANE courtesy during all competition. Only 2 bowlers per team will be allowed to stand during a match – the one that is currently bowling and the player on deck. All other bowlers must be seated. Coaches and tournament managers should make this a point of emphasis in player and coach meetings prior to competition.

Alcohol, Tobacco, and Food Policies

No alcohol or tobacco may be sold or consumed by spectators, coaches, or athletes during competition. This includes the use of e-cigarettes or other smoking devices. Please make sure your parents and

athletes are aware that outside food and drinks may not be brought into the bowling center per Health Department guidelines. If certain dietary requirements need to be met, please discuss with the tournament director. Monitor Lanes has a full-service snack bar and vending available for purchase. No coolers or oversized bags will be permitted by spectators or bowlers.

Spectator Code of Conduct

Spectators are not allowed in the bowling area where team members are seated. There will be no taunting or otherwise jeering of the opposing players. Respectful and encouraging cheering is encouraged. Noisemakers are not permitted. There will be a designated area for player passing in front of the spectator area that MUST be kept clear at all times.

Paddock

Bowler paddock areas will be designated behind each bowler's starting pair of lanes. This will allow bowlers to stay within the bowling area minimizing the need to enter onto the main concourse during competition for ball changes or other equipment needs, and will decrease the chances of injury due to potential contact with wet floor surfaces.
