





Allen Park competitive cheer coach Julie Goodwin calls Round 3 her team's "money round." And did the Jaguars ever make it pay off last winter at Central Michigan University's McGuirk Arena.

Allen Park and Gibraltar Carlson had combined to win every MHSAA Division 2 Final championship over the last 16 seasons – and entered Round 3 this time separated by a mere 54 hundredths of a point.

That was just shy of the margin Carlson won by, over Allen Park, at last year's championship meet. But the margin of victory this time would not be so close.

The Jaguars cashed in big with a seemingly flawless routine, their 322. 40 the highest Round 3 score at the Finals in any division since 2012, and pulled away from the field to finish with 793. 34 points and their fourth championship over the last five seasons

"It felt so incredible. That was the round that we were waiting to perform all season," Allen Park junior Abigail Obrycki said. "It felt perfect. It felt like everybody gave exactly what they were supposed to do, and it was just perfect.

"It's what we love to do. We love stunting. We love perfecting it and getting everything exactly how it's supposed to be."

Allen Park led by only two tenths of a point after Round 1, with Carlson just behind, and was able to extend that lead only another 34 hundredths of a point in Round 2.

Carleton Airport finished runner-up, its highest at a Finals since finishing Class B runner-up in 2003.

Airport finished with a score of 779.92, with Dearborn Divine Child right behind at 779.84. Carlson was in that mix as well at 778.10, followed by Cedar Springs, Middleville Thornapple Kellogg, Plainwell and Muskegon Reeths-Puffer.

Division 1

"The Rochester Invitational," an event also known as the MHSAA Division 1 Competitive Cheer Finals, proved a great rivalry pushes everyone to be their best.

The MHSAA represents schools covering more than 96,000 square miles in Michigan, but the Division 1 battle came down to three Rochester Community Schools all located within four miles of each other – Rochester, Rochester Adams and Rochester Hills Stoney Creek.

The teams have tussled at the Oakland Activities Association Red level, followed by District, Regional and Finals for years, with the difference between them often coming down to a tenth of a point, or less.

Rochester Adams won the Finals for the third-straight year in 2022, Rochester took the title in 2023 and, appropriately enough, Stoney Creek led from start-to-finish in 2024.


Stoney Creek finished with a score of 792.98 - good for a 1.42-point margin of victory over second-place Adams (791.56), with Rochester a mere two-tenths of a point further back in third at 791.36.

Adams actually posted the best score of the three schools in the final round, enough to leapfrog Rochester but not enough to overtake Stoney Creek.



In 2024, Croswell-Lexington had come to McGuirk Arena seeking its first MHSAA Competitive Cheer championship, and pushed past two of the most successful programs in state history to claim it – by a mere seventenths of a point.

Croswell-Lexington gave off the same competitive vibe – and then backed it up again. Just like a year earlier, the Pioneers entered Round 3 of the Division 3 Final chasing the lead. And again, Cros-Lex delivered the day's best third round to push into first – this time by four-tenths of a point ahead of Pontiac Notre Dame Prep.



The Pioneers scored 782.52, followed by NDP at 782.12 and Grosse Ile at 781.34. Cros-Lex scored a 319.60 in Round 3 to make up a half-point deficit on the Fighting Irish and hold on for the win.


Cros-Lex and Grosse IIe both scored 234.50 in Round 1 on Saturday to trail Notre Dame Prep by nine tenths of a point. The Pioneers made back four tenths of deficit with a meet-best 228.42 for Round 2 as all three of those contenders reached 228 points and pulled away from the pack – setting up plenty of anticipation for Round 3.

Division 4

Hudson certainly was not overconfident in 2024 despite ending the previous year by winning a fourth-straight MHSAA Division 4 competitive cheer championship.

In fact, the Tigers were the opposite.

"The girls lacked confidence this year, to be honest," said Hudson coach Kelly Bailey. "That was actually our biggest obstacle to overcome."



It didn't help that the Tigers got off to a slow start in the Final – they sat in fourth place after the first round. But that just set the stage for a powerhouse performance during the final two rounds, as Hudson rolled to its fifth consecutive Division 4 title.

Hudson won with 746.30 points, followed by Pewamo-Westphalia (736.42) and Michigan Center (733.94).

Hudson now has finished either first or second in Division 4 for eight straight years, with six titles.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2025

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 36 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2024-25 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2025-26 school year. This year, a total of 1,513 applications from 431 schools were received for 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Baksetball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.





Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

ight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2024-25 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to serve on the Student Advisory Council in 2024-25 are: Itzel Albarran, Bronson; Harper Barnhart, Brownstown Woodhaven; Diamond Cook, Southfield Christian; Henry Ewles, Pontiac Notre Dame Prep; Cole Haist, Big Rapids; Frannie Keeley, Jenison; Trey LaValley, Romeo; and Ethan Stine, Bridgman.

Those eight new members were selected from 90 applicants. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 142 schools from 51 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 10 MHSAA sports, and five will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council handed out championship trophies at Finals events, led sessions during four Sportsmanship Summits and provided assistance at the

MHSAA Representative Council

he Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

MICHIGAN ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP



Michigan high school seniors and students who recently graduated from high school may be eligible for the Michigan Achievement Scholarship.

Community College Guarantee

All students are eligible for the Community College Guarantee (regardless of family income), which includes:

- Earning a skills certificate or associate degree tuition-free at their indistrict community college!*
- An additional \$1,000 Michigan Achievement Bonus for Pell-eligible students to use toward additional college costs.

Public or Private University

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a Public or Private University.

- Up to \$27,500 to earn a bachelor's degree—that's \$5,500 per year for up to five years.
- 7 in 10 high school graduates are eligible.
- Find out if you are eligible by completing the FAFSA.

Career Training

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a career training program.

- Up to \$4,000 to earn a skill certificate—that's \$2,000 per year for up to two years.
- Find out if your program is eligible by visiting michigan.gov/careertraining.

*Students would receive a significant tuition discount if they attend an out-of-district community college.
