Northville Extends Title Streak

Ethan Powell (right) was grateful to be part of three team championships with Northville at MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 1 Cross Country Finals, but sometimes he wonders if things could've turned out better his freshman year.

The Mustangs finished fourth that season with 204 points in a meet won by Kensington Lakes Activities Association West rival Brighton with 141.

Powell finished 94th that year in 16 minutes, 41.28 seconds.

"My freshman year, we had a chance to win it, too," Powell said. "I underperformed. I was part of the reason we didn't win it. We took fourth that year. I was just really bummed out."

Powell never left Michigan International Speedway feeling that way the rest of his career.

He led Northville to its third consecutive Division 1 championship last fall by a dominant 99-169 margin over Saline.

The Mustangs are the first Division 1 boys team to win three titles in a row since Milford from 2011-13. Powell is the only runner who was in the Finals lineup for all three championships.

Northville was ranked No. 1 all season, winning the KLAA championship by a 36-68 margin over a Brighton team that finished third at MIS. The Mustangs' league included four of the top 10 teams in the Division 1 Final.

"This year, we've just been grinding. Some people don't really understand the behind-the-scenes part of it. Every day, it's work. It's making sure we're doing what we're doing, not slacking off. We have this saying: 'Don't bite the bait, don't take the cheese.' We're making sure not to get too boastful or too ahead of ourselves, knowing anything can happen."

Northville had four runners make all-state by finishing among the top 30, including three in the top 10. Powell was seventh in 15:24.8, junior Ben Hartigan was ninth in 15:27.7, sophomore Brandon Cloud was 10th in 15:29.0, senior Nick Barretto was 25th in 15:41.7.

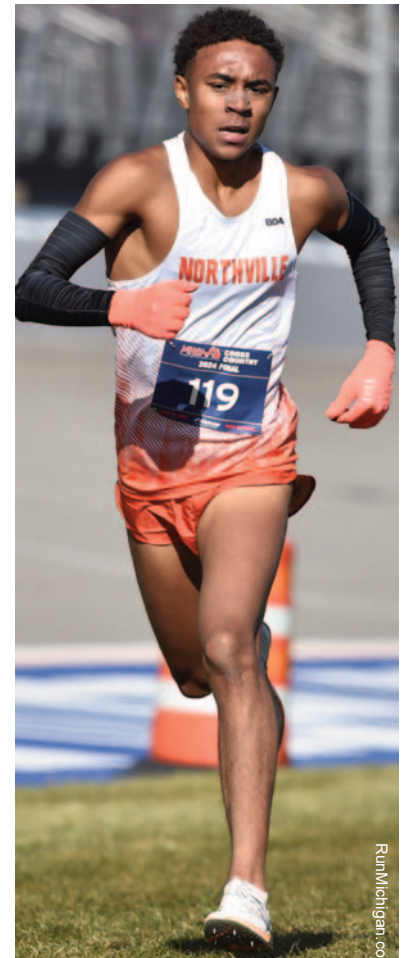
The battle for the individual championship was won by Jenison senior Seth Conner, whose time of 14:54.5 ranks 11th in the 29-year history of the Finals at MIS.

Conner played soccer and ran cross country early in his high school career. He didn't make it to MIS as a freshman, finishing 45th at Regionals, but he gave up soccer to focus on running after that.

He never envisioned becoming a Finals champion.

"Oh, no," he said. "I was a soccer player, so freshman year I came in and didn't really have any goals. Nobody probably would've seen this coming. Last year, I was like, 'I'm gonna win state. Let's see what happens.'"

Conner had a comfortable lead as he cruised down the final stretch at MIS, having made a decisive move about halfway through the race. Canton junior Aiden Pengelly charged from behind to nip Milford junior Kyle O'Rourke at the finish line to take second place by one second in 15:01.0.



Championship Sweep for Whitmore Lake

When Kaylie Livingston (right) finished second to Buckley senior Aiden Harrard at the 2023 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Finals, the moment she enjoyed one year later seemed inevitable.

After finishing as the Division 4 Final runner-up as a freshman, Livingston dominated the field to take first place in 18 minutes, 6.5 seconds at Michigan International Speedway in 2024.

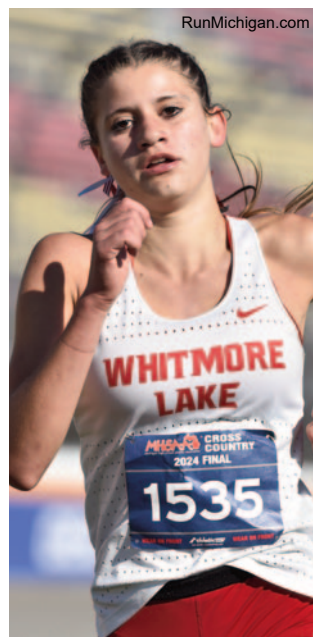
Eliza Keith of Auburn Hills Oakland Christian was second in 18:20.1.

"That motivated me a lot," Livingston said of her runner-up finish. "Aiden was an amazing runner. I got to train with her, and she helped me my first year to know the course, when to speed up and when to kick."

Livingston was no stranger to MIS when she arrived in Brooklyn her freshman year, but watching the Finals as a spectator and racing the course are two entirely different experiences.

"I've been coming here since I was younger," she said. "It was my first time racing it. I was just happy to execute my finish today."

Livingston actually ran a faster time in 2023, going 17:44.7, but she didn't need the extra gear this



time. When she hit the mile mark in 5:39.5, she already had an 8.6-second lead. That lead increased to 21.6 seconds at the two-mile mark.

"It wasn't my fastest mile of the season," Livingston said. "It was a little behind. I had to make up for it in the last two miles."

Livingston was Whitmore Lake's first individual champion since Betsy Speer won the Class D team race with the fastest time of the day in 1995. The Trojans had winners at the Finals four straight years from 1992-95, with Speer also winning in 1993.

Whitmore Lake repeated as team champion by a 110-125 margin over Oakland Christian. The Trojans had only one senior in their lineup, No. 6 runner Isabella Nelson-Daniels. All five scoring runners were underclassmen.

Whitmore Lake had three all-staters (top 30) in Livingston, 11th-place junior Carina Burchi (19:20.3) and 24th-place junior Elodie Weaver (19:53.0). Also scoring for the Trojans were freshman Malynda Lambros, who was 63rd in 20:57.7, and junior Sofia Robertson, who was 65th in 20:59.5.

Division 1 Girls

Ann Arbor Pioneer's Rachel Forsyth shattered the MHSAA girls course record at Michigan International Speedway in 2023.

Midland Dow senior **Victoria Garces** (right) was in that same race — albeit from a distance, like everyone else — when Forsyth posted her epic time of 16 minutes, 28.5 seconds to lower the MIS girls record by a jaw-dropping 23.6 seconds.

Fast forward one year and Garces established herself as one of the all-time greats in Michigan cross country history by winning the 2024 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 1 Final in 16:37.1, the second-fastest ever at MIS.

"Honestly, I'm in shock," said Garces, who was fifth at both of the prior two Division 1 Finals. "I'm just so grateful to be anywhere near Rachel Forsyth's time, because she's just incredible."

Romeo repeated as team champion with a dominant performance, putting six of its seven runners on the all-state podium with top-30 finishes.

The Bulldogs scored 61 points to best runner-up Saline by 82. Romeo had six runners across the line before Saline's second runner finished.

Division 2 Boys

TJ Hansen of Freeland repeated as the MHSAA champion by lowering his Division 2 record to 14:50.5, the fourth-fastest time in any division at MIS.

He needed every bit of that effort, as Marshall senior Jack Bidwell took second in 14:57.3, a time that is the third-fastest by a Division 2 runner and 14th all-time in any division.

Hansen and Bidwell reached the two-mile mark together in 9:36.2 before the defending champion pulled away in the final mile.

"It was really just try to push the pace and see how fast I could go," Hansen said. "My legs weren't really feeling it today, so I changed up strategy to race to win."

In the team race, Allendale won its first MHSAA Finals championship since 1999 by placing its five scoring runners among the top 29. The Falcons scored 78 points to win by 102 over 2023 champion Ada Forest Hills Eastern.

Sophomore Mason Hill was ninth in 15:24.0, senior Kilian Whalen 13th in 15:28.8, junior Ronnie Silveira 15th in 15:31.1, senior Ben Gross 27th in 15:47.1 and senior Parker Tiethof 29th in 15:48.3.

Division 2 Girls

It took Ava Schafer of St. Johns a year to make a significant dent in her cross country personal record. And, she made her breakthrough on the biggest stage in Michigan high school cross country.

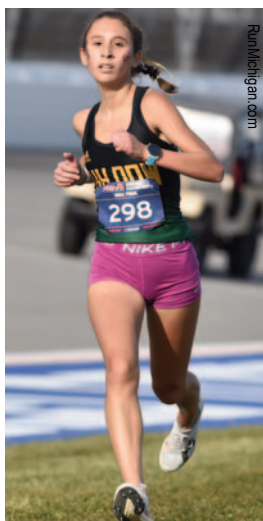
Schafer completed an undefeated sophomore season by winning the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 2 Final with a time of 17 minutes, 20.7 seconds at Michigan International Speedway.

"This season hasn't been all PRs," Schafer said. "It's been about the same times as last year. I'm really proud of this one. It will boost my confidence in my performance and my times."

Schafer had a solo run down the final stretch at MIS, winning by 10.3 seconds ahead of Otsego junior Emma Hoffman. It was a clash between two runners who hadn't lost a race all year.

In the team race, Goodrich returned to the top for the first time since winning three straight Division 3 championships from 2003-05. The top-ranked Martians scored 134 points to win by 16 over second-ranked Zeeland East.

Seniors Kamryn Lauinger and Avery Byrne ran in four MHSAA Finals. Lauinger was 19th in 18:36.7, sophomore Alivia Ottinger was 22nd in 18:37.8, Byrne was 42nd in 19:06.6, senior Layla Jordan was 44th in 19:08.4 and freshman Kayla Shellenbarger was 47th in 19:10.6.



Division 3 Boys

Onsted's Mitchell Hiatt reached the end of a long road that would eventually make him an MHSAA Finals champion last fall.

"When I was a freshman, I only ran 19 minutes," Hiatt said after winning the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 3 Final in 15:15.5 at MIS. "I didn't think I'd be able to be a state champ. It took a lot of running. It's good to see hard work pay off."

Reed City senior August Rohde came into the meet with the fastest time in Division 3, and both he and Hiatt reached the mile mark in 4:52. Separation began in the second mile, with Hiatt hitting the two-mile mark in 9:49.3 and Rohde in 9:57.9.

As he made his way down the long straightaway at MIS, Hiatt had a large lead over Rohde, but he wouldn't allow himself to make the final couple hundred yards a victory lap.

Traverse City St. Francis repeated as the team champion by an 86-177 margin over Saugatuck, putting four runners on the all-state podium.

Senior Riley Pattinson was 10th in 15:51.9, sophomore William Ready 11th in 15:52.2, senior Owen Read 22nd in 16:03.7, senior Robby Myler 27th in 16:13.2 and senior Josh Slocum 39th in 16:26.3.

The Gladiators had four runners cross the line before Saugatuck's first finisher.

Division 3 Girls

Stanton Central Montcalm's Kyah Hoffman endured an up-and-down season, finishing on a definite upside, a 17:31.6 performance good for first place in the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 3 Final at Michigan International Speedway.

"It's been ups and downs," Hoffman said. "At first, I was super scared because I was like, 'I haven't PR'd. I've barely reached the 17s. I don't know if I'm going to PR this year.' I was so nervous."

Hoffman made it happen by putting in a surge in the second mile after her and Emmry Ross of Onsted reached the mile mark in 5:38.8. At the two-mile mark, Hoffman's lead increased to 9.1 seconds.

The team race had four teams in the hunt heading into the final mile.

Only 23 points separated the top four, with Lansing Catholic emerging from the fray with its second Finals championship by a 136-147 margin over Pewamo-Westphalia. Central Montcalm was third with 157 points, and Traverse City St. Francis was fourth with 159.

Josie Bishop, led Lansing Catholic by placing 20th in 19:01.8. The Cougars had five runners cross the line among the first 38 places in the team race and first 60 overall.

Division 4 Boys

After a hard-fought race, juniors **Marek Butkiewicz** (below) of Kalamazoo Hackett Catholic Prep and Abenezzer Cerone of Royal Oak Shrine Catholic parked themselves on the ground at a fence near the finish line, clasped hands and exchanged congratulations.

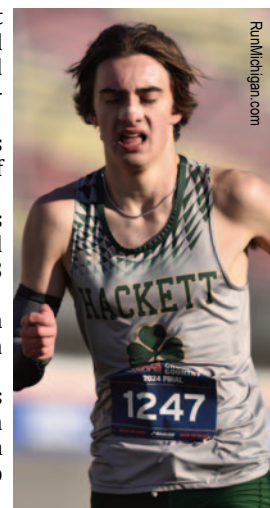
"It's great," Butkiewicz said after shattering the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 4 Finals record with a time of 15 minutes, 9.7 seconds at Michigan International Speedway. "We all love communicating with each other and talking with each other. The running community is super-close. It's just a blast."

Butkiewicz broke the Division 4 Finals record of 15:22.4 set by Tec Adams of Harbor Springs in 2008.

Hillsdale Academy repeated as Finals team champion by winning for the third time in four years. The Colts scored 113 points to win by 40 over Holland Calvary.

Junior Grayson Rorick was fourth in 15:57.1 and senior Reece Poole eighth in 16:13.4 to lead Hillsdale Academy.

Rounding out Hillsdale Academy's scoring were junior James Rahe (37th in 16:55.9), junior Henry Lindley (47th in 17:05.4) and junior Luke Molenkamp (52nd in 17:12.8).

Michigan International Speedway

Michigan International Speedway is the site for the 2023 Michigan High School Athletic Association Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals — the 29th time the Finals for all classes, both boys and girls, will be held on the same course on the same day.

Michigan International Speedway opened in 1968. Over 2.5 million tons of earth was moved to construct the two-mile oval and two, 1.9-mile road courses. The road courses wind through the infield and behind the backstretch, parts of which form the route the runners will follow today. Runners could see a variety of wildlife while winding through the hilly terrain behind the backstretch, including many deer which live on the property. MIS is home to one of Michigan's largest paid-admission sporting events each year. Fans also enjoy NASCAR and ARCA Menard Series events during race weekends in June and August.

Michigan International Speedway has provided the use of this unique, 1,400-acre facility, as well as many of its services to the MHSAA for this meet at a discounted rate. The MHSAA hopes you enjoy your visit to the beautiful Irish Hills.

Spectator Viewing

Spectators may view today's races from the main grandstands, on pit road or from designated course locations. To access the infield/pit road area use the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel located south of the main grandstands in turn 1. Please note that access to the finish area, garage area and infield suites are restricted to the athletes, coaches and officials.

Handicap Sections

Handicapped/wheelchair access is located in the main grandstands. Handicapped/wheelchair access is also available in Victory Lane near the finish area. Paved handicap parking is available in Lot 11, which is located across the street from the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel entrance.

First Aid

Medical assistance is available through Jackson Community Ambulance services.

Restrooms

Public facilities are available under the main grandstands. Facilities are also available on the infield.

Lost & Found

Please take any recovered articles to the packet pick up/results room.

Concessions & Finals Merchandise

Refreshments and food can be purchased in the concession area behind the south end of the main grandstands and in two locations near the infield awards area. Souvenir t-shirts, sweatshirts, souvenir programs and photographs will be sold at infield locations near the start line and awards area.

Spectator Videotaping & Still Photography

Spectator videotaping and still photography are allowed at the Cross Country Finals with the understanding that the tape or images are for personal use only and not to be sold, leased, borrowed, rented or duplicated for commercial purposes or shown on television or the Internet. Videotaping and still photography must be done in a manner that does not obstruct the view of other spectators.

The team and individual awards staging area will take place near the team parking area behind the suites.

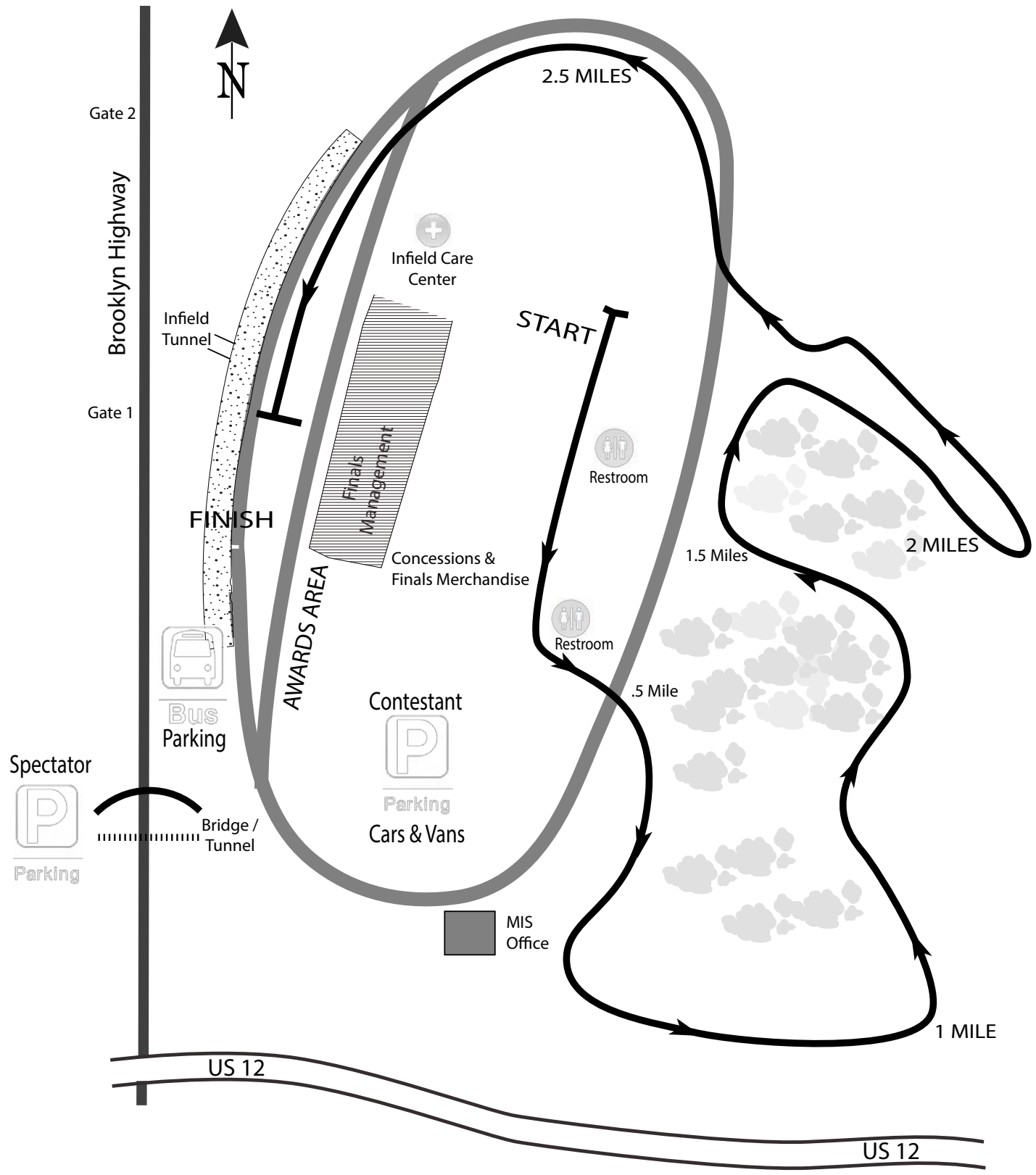

Participating in Multiple Sports, Activities Continues to be Best Route to Success

There has been an ongoing debate for years regarding the advantages or disadvantages of focusing on one sport during teen and high school years vs. playing multiple sports.

Some people have argued to be successful in a particular sport at the college level requires a person to devote all energy to that sport throughout high school. While this approach may work for some, an ever-increasing majority of athletes believe playing multiple sports leads to more success – on the athletic front and careers outside sports as well.

And recent events would substantiate that viewpoint regardless of age. Athletes who competed in high school sports many years ago, as well as current and recent participants, have similar views.

All four former high school athletes who were inducted into the NFHS National High School Hall of Fame this summer played multiple sports in high school.

Anna Maria Lopez participated in volleyball, basketball, and track and field at St. Mary's Academy in Portland, Oregon, before excelling at volleyball at the University of Southern California. Caryn Schoff-Kovatch, the leading scorer in New York high school girls basketball history at St. Johnsville High School, also was all-league in soccer and softball.

Tim Dwight was a standout football and track athlete at City High School in Iowa City, Iowa, before his stellar college and professional careers. And Prince Amukamara played football, basketball, and track and field at Apollo High School in Glendale, Arizona, before his 11-year NFL career.

"I think it is truly beneficial to play multiple sports," Amukamara said. "I was just a natural-born competitor, and I felt like I was good at a lot of things, so I never thought the one-sport mindset was for me. Growing up, I was so thankful for a program out here in Arizona called GRASP (Glendale Recreation After School Program). They really encouraged us to do a lot of sports. I was pretty good at a lot of sports, and I loved competing, so I tried them all."

In the recent NFL Draft, 222 of the 253 athletes (88 percent) who were drafted participated in multiple sports in high school. Miami quarterback Cam Ward, the No. 1 selection, played basketball and football at Columbia High School in Texas. Other first-rounders who excelled at multiple sports included Tyler Warren, tight end from Penn State who played football, basketball and baseball at Atlee High School in Mechanicsville, Virginia, and Jaxson Dart, University of Mississippi quarterback who played football and baseball in Draper, Utah.

Emeka Egbuka, wide receiver from Ohio State, played football and baseball at Steilacoom High School in Washington and credits baseball as a contributing factor to his athleticism.

More recently, similar stories of playing multiple sports were shared at the NFHS National Student Leadership Summit held last week in Indianapolis. During one of the general sessions, more than 90 percent of the 211 attendees, all

of whom were junior or seniors currently involved in high school sports or other activity programs, indicated they currently were participating in multiple sports.

Playing multiple sports in high school is truly a winning formula. In addition to enhancing chances for a college scholarship and playing a sport at the highest level, there are innumerable benefits for the 95 percent of high school athletes who will not play at higher levels.

Multiple-sport participants have a reduced risk of overuse injuries, are able to learn from multiple coaches, participate in cross-training which leads to better athleticism, have better mental development and teamwork skills, and have a reduced chance of burnout in sports. Further, students can enjoy multiple activities concurrently, such as participation on a sports team while also belonging to a performing arts group.

It is incumbent on coaches, administrators and state associations to pave the way for students to be involved in multiple sports – and other activity programs. Many have done a great job at opening these doors, including Jane Berry-Eddings, longtime speech and debate coach at Sprague High School in Salem, Oregon, who was inducted into the National High School Hall of Fame earlier this summer.

"I've had students who were drum majors and students who were on the track and cross country teams, and I've had football players and basketball players who were involved in speech and debate," said Berry-Eddings. "I've always encouraged them to look at their schedule and pick what they wanted to do."

NFHS member state associations continue to add more sport offerings, which make it possible for more students to be involved in a sport or activity of their choosing. Most recently, the Hawaii High School Athletic Association added its 21st sport – surfing – to its offerings of state championships.

Whether the goal is to participate in high school sports and activities to have fun with their peers, or to achieve a college athletic scholarship, or to be a lifelong participant, the best route to achieving a successful, healthy balance in life is to participate in multiple sports and other activities. time.

Scholar-Athlete Award in 37th Year Awarding Scholarships to Students

Thousands of students voluntarily extend their classroom day by taking part in extracurricular activities, often improving their academic achievements in the process. The value that such programs play in the total education of a high school student is highlighted through the MHSAA/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award, which will award \$2,000 scholarships to 32 top student-athletes and recognize over 2,000 other outstanding individuals in 2025-26.

Underwritten by Farm Bureau Insurance, the Scholar-Athlete Award is now in its 37th year, and presents scholarships to students in every MHSAA enrollment classification. The scholarships may be used at any institution of higher learning.

"It is amazing to see the number of young people who are proven achievers in academics and activities," said Mark Uyl, executive director of the MHSAA. "At a time when our educational system is coming under fire, the Scholar-Athlete Award is something that proves

how important athletics are to the development of a well-rounded person."

Students applying for the Scholar-Athlete Award must be graduating during the 2025-26 school year, carry a 3.5 grade-point average, and have previously won a letter in a varsity sport that the MHSAA sponsors postseason competition.

Applicants will also be required to show involvement in other school/community activities and submit an essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Each MHSAA member school is allowed to nominate a number of student-athletes based on the size of the school. Class A schools can nominate six boys and six girls, Class B four boys and four girls, Class C three boys and three girls and Class D two boys and two girls. The first 30 scholarships will be awarded based on this graduated scale, with two additional scholarships intended



for minority applicants.

A committee composed of school administrators from across the state will select regional and statewide winners.

The 32 scholarship recipients will be recognized at the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Student Events Center in East Lansing in March 2026.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who are juniors at their schools during the 2025-26 academic year are serving two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2025-26 are: **Nichole James**, Detroit Edison; **Mia McGregor**, Mio; **Camryn Siegers**, Holland Christian; **Lucy Weber**, Fenton; **Brody Hammer**, Middleville Thornapple-Kellogg; **Sam Bentley**, Ypsilanti Lincoln; **Mason Mireles**, Hartford; and **Joey Smokevitch**, Johannesburg-Lewiston.

Those eight new members were selected from 125 applicants, the second largest group of applicants in the 20 years of the council. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 148 schools from 53 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 11 MHSAA sports, and six will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets eight times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council handed out championship trophies at Finals events, led

MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

Michigan high school seniors and students who recently graduated from high school may be eligible for the Michigan Achievement Scholarship.

Community College Guarantee

All students are eligible for the Community College Guarantee (regardless of family income), which includes:

- Earning a skills certificate or associate degree tuition-free at their in- district community college!*
- An additional \$1,000 Michigan Achievement Bonus for Pell-eligible students to use toward additional college costs.

Public or Private University

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a Public or Private University.

- Up to \$27,500 to earn a bachelor's degree—that's \$5,500 per year for up to five years.
- 7 in 10 high school graduates are eligible.
- Find out if you are eligible by completing the FAFSA.

Career Training

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a career training program.

- Up to \$4,000 to earn a skill certificate—that's \$2,000 per year for up to two years.
- Find out if your program is eligible by visiting michigan.gov/careertraining.

*Students would receive a significant tuition discount if they attend an out-of-district community college.
