POWERS CATHOLIC GETS NO. 1

ow far back do Flint Powers Catholic seniors Mason Czarnecki and Cooper Gerhardt go in their hockey careers together?

About as far back as you can go in the sport.

"We've played since day one," Czarnecki said. "I think we were pushing the chair around together."

From humble beginnings playing house league with the Flint Icelanders at Flint Iceland Arenas to their days winning travel hockey championships with the Flint Junior Firebirds, Czarnecki and Gerhardt developed a connection that few teammates possess.

That bond came in handy in the final seconds of the 2023 MHSAA Division 3 championship game at USA Hockey Arena.

Following a faceoff in the Powers zone, Gerhardt got the puck and spotted Czarnecki taking off through the neutral zone. Gerhardt sent him a perfect outlet pass, springing Czarnecki on a breakaway; and into history.

Czarnecki scored on that breakaway with only 4.6 seconds left on the clock, giving the Chargers their first championship in their eighth Finals appearance with a 3-2 victory over East Grand Rapids.

It was the latest game-winning goal in regulation time in Finals history, eclipsing Alex Hamady's goal with 6.7 seconds left for Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice to beat Byron Center in a Division 2 Final two years earlier.

"The ref dropped the puck and the puck was just sitting there," Gerhardt said. "I looked up and (Czarnecki) was just flying down the ice. There's a gap between the two 'D.' I just threw it and hoped for the best.

"The rest is history."

And the ultimate memory to strengthen the bond between two great friends.

"For him to give me that pass on the big stage and to make it happen with four seconds left, I'm in awe right now," said Czarnecki, who scored 30 goals on the season and 64 during his career. "This is crazy. I'll remember this for the rest of our lives."

It was not only the first championship for Powers, but the first for a Genesee County school after five had lost in the Finals.

Travis Perry coached Powers teams that reached the Finals before, losing 1-0 in overtime to Calumet in 2008 and 3-1 to Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook Kingswood in 2010. He had a 27-1 team lose in the Semifinals in 2017.

He wondered if this day would ever arrive. "It's been 17 years that I've had a lot of great players," said Perry, who played for Powers. "It's been 50 years of just struggles, be it bad bounces, we've had bad games down here. It's 50 years of frustration that came off, so it's great to see."



It's never been easy when Powers has reached the Finals, going all the way back to a 6-2 loss to Houghton in 1982 in the hometown at IMA Sports Arena.

So, even though the Chargers took control with an early 2-0 lead against East Grand Rapids, the historic championship was going to put Powers and its fans through the emotional wringer.

Czarnecki and Brody Neelands scored to give Powers a 2-0 lead in the first 14 minutes, 6 seconds, but East Grand Rapids goalie Austin Stankowski then shut out the Chargers until the final seconds.

Tyler Sikkenga, whose goal in the final seconds forced overtime in a 2-1 upset of No. 1-ranked Houghton in the Semifinals, scored at 2:29 of the second period and 9:00 of the third to tie the game.

Then, for once, the most important bounce went Powers' way.

"These guys have played together their whole lives," Perry said. "That's part of it, too. Mason takes off and knows Coop's gonna get him the puck. We score, half the team is crying; we're out of sorts. We still have five seconds left. I'm trying to get everybody under control. I think I was a little out of sorts. It's hard to put into words what it feels like right now."

The victory came one year after a 3-2 loss to eventual Division 3 champion Midland Dow in a Regional championship game, one of the few years in which Powers didn't win a Regional. The Chargers have won 35 Regionals, second in MHSAA history only to the 38 won by 14-time Finals champion Trenton.

"I actually printed out a picture of the scoreboard," Powers senior Greg Feamster said. "Every morning, I'd wake up and look at that picture and think about how it felt. So, every day just working out, working with the team practices, I think of that moment. The seniors know what it felt like. It really pushed us and allowed us to get over that hump."

East Grand Rapids was also on a quest to make history, having lost 3-2 to Dearborn Divine Child in its only Finals trip in 2002.

This wasn't a Pioneers team that looked like a candidate to play on the final day of the season, having gone 10-11-2 during the regular season. But East Grand Rapids beat No. 6 Grand Rapids Catholic Central in the Regional Final, No. 7 Bay Reps in the Quarterfinals and then pulled off the ultimate upset over No. 1 Houghton in the Semifinals to reach the championship game.

"That's something we'll hang our hat on a little bit later," East Grand Rapids coach Christopher Newton said. "Obviously, this one stings. But we proved this weekend we can play with some of the best teams in the state. I'm proud of our kids. They left everything out there. They have nothing to be ashamed of."

Nicholas Kurtiak turned aside 23 of 25 shots for Powers, while Stankowski stopped 24 of 27.

NOTHING DOING: DCC BLANKS FOES FOR D1 CROWN

Detroit Catholic Central removed the most valuable commodity from its hockey opponents during the 2023 MHSAA Tournament.

Hope.

If the Shamrocks got a lead, the game was pretty much over, whether the teams they faced wanted to admit it or not.

You can't beat a team without scoring a goal. Catholic Central became the first team in the 49-year history of the MHSAA tournament to not surrender a goal, capping a perfect defensive postseason with a 3-0 victory over Brighton in the Division 1 championship game before 4,090 fans at USA Hockey Arena.

Catholic Central outscored five teams by a combined score of 30-0 during the playoffs. The previous record for the fewest goals allowed in the postseason was two, achieved by the 2009 Catholic Central team over six games.


"It starts with the forwards, and then the defense and then the goalies," Catholic Central senior forward Landon West said. "We know we can't win games by trying to outscore teams. You've got to keep pucks in front of your net. We do everything we can."

Backstopping the latest shutout was senior Luca Naurato, who stopped all 20 shots he faced. Naurato finished with a 0.87 goals against average, a .941 save percentage and seven shutouts.

"It's just another game at the end of the day, right?" Naurato said. "I felt pretty confident going in after warm-ups, and it just happened to work out that way."

Naurato alternated in net all season with fellow senior Kyle Moore, who had a 0.73 GAA, .948 save percentage and nine shutouts.

The Shamrocks, who won their fourth-consecutive Division 1 crown, have gone with a timeshare in net during the last three seasons. Nicholas Galda and Bob Masters rotated in net each of the past two seasons.



"It's a team effort," Naurato said. "We played a defensive game, and it translated into the offensive zone."

Opponents know they must be almost perfect against the Shamrocks (29-1), who allowed only 22 goals in 30 games.

"They don't give you anything easy," said Brighton coach Kurt Kivisto, whose team lost 2-1 and 3-0 to Catholic Central. "They don't make mistakes. They're really, really structured. They play an honest, hard-working game."

The Bulldogs were a team known for coming back from multiple-goal deficits this season, but that's nearly an impossible task against Catholic Central.

Although the shots were close, with the Shamrocks holding a 24-20 edge, Catholic Central was never seriously threatened after taking a 2-0 lead in the first period on goals by Jackson Walsh and Nolan Galda.

RICE COMEBACK NETS WARRIORS D2 TITLE

Lenny Chaput, hockey coach at Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice, paused when trying to describe his relationship with sophomore forward Roman Villaire. "Him and I have had about a year and a half of ... fun," Chaput said. Care to elaborate?

"We've had our ups and downs as far as getting on him," Chaput said. "He's literally been all over our lineup from the first line to the fourth line and threats of playing JV hockey and everything else around the way. Again, it's because the talent's there."

The talent Chaput believed Villaire possesses blossomed in the playoffs and burst through at precisely the right moment for the Warriors in the 2023 MHSAA Division 2 championship game at USA Hockey Arena.

Villaire scored what proved to be the winning goal in a 4-2 victory over top-ranked Byron Center with a great individual play.

He picked up the puck at the Rice blue line, skated one-on-one against a defender, made a quick move to open up a shooting lane and fired the puck into the upper right corner of the net with 4:42 left in the game to break a 2-2 tie.

"I just saw (the defenseman) go down to one knee, saw I had a shot, took it to the middle and just put it top right," Villaire said.

Coming into the playoffs, Villaire had enjoyed a decent regular season, but wasn't one of the Warriors' impact players. He had three goals and eight assists in 26 regular-season games, but scored four goals with five assists in five postseason contests.

"That's not a grinder goal right there," Chaput said. "That's a skilled kid who can really bring the offense. He's had to learn the other things around the game — playing harder, playing more defensive, and he's done it."

While Villaire became an unlikely hero during the Warriors' run to their seventh MHSAA championship, star forward Peter Rosa performed like the elite player he is.

Byron Center took a 2-0 lead into the third period on first-period goals by Logan Nickolaus and Cade Pratt before Rosa scored three of the Warriors' four unanswered goals.

He began the comeback with a shorthanded breakaway goal at 1:37 of the third and tied the game with a shot off a faceoff win by Jack Cassidy at 10:42.


After Villaire gave Rice the lead, Rosa completed his hat trick and secured the championship by scoring into an empty net with 20.7 seconds remaining.

School Spirit is Defining Difference in HS Sports

s Education-based sports in our nation's schools are Adifferent than any other level of competition.

Youth leagues and club sports often require significant entry fees, and in many cases, the focus is on competitive success with little concern for skill development, team building or sportsmanship.

High-profile college sports have been disrupted by issues concerning media contracts, NIL and the transfer portal, with the environment a bit like the "Wild West" on campuses throughout the country.

Professional sports, of course, are about the most elite performance, entertainment and winning championships.

Sports in our nation's 19,800-plus high schools instead are much more focused on education, relationships, team unity, having fun and school spirit.

School spirit is perhaps the defining difference between interscholastic and other levels of sports - having pride in one's school, maintaining a connection to the school and coaches for life, supporting all school teams and programs whether a participant or a fan, and contributing to the bond between school and community.

On an individual basis, pride is a key component of school spirit. Students who become involved in sports take pride in their teams and school and tend to carry that pride to their future careers after high school.

High school sports have the potential to boost the spirit of communities as well. There are countless examples every year but one such community was the small town of Fertile, Minnesota, located about 270 miles northwest of Minneapolis. In 2021, Jude Olson, a junior on the Fertile-Beltrami High School nine-player football team, was killed in an accident, which shook the approximately 1,000 residents of Fertile.

Last year, however, the Fertile-Beltrami football team provided a positive boost to the town with an undefeated regular season and a first-ever trip to the Minnesota State High School League Nine-player State Football Championship at U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

According to an article in the Grand Forks (North Dakota) Herald, many of the town's residents did not have the means to make the five-hour trek to the game. As a result, local businesses and farmers donated \$25,000 for five charter buses to make sure every fan who wanted to make the trip had a free ride to the game.

"It means a lot to the whole town," said Jodie Strem, the co-owner of Fertile Oil Company. "We want (the players) to look in the stands and see us and know we are there for them. We are coming down full force."

While the Fertile-Beltrami Falcons lost to LeRoy-Ostrander in the MSHSL Nine-player Championship, the players and the 274 fans who made the journey will remember much more than the outcome of the game.

This is school spirit at its core and why high school sports are different.

High school activity programs boost the spirit of individuals, teams and communities. Research indicated that in 2020 when these programs were shut down because of the pandemic, the mental health of students was drastically compromised.

In the post-pandemic world, there are fewer face-to-face meetings. High school activities have played a major role in bringing people back together. We know that when schools have strong school spirit, communities respond with support and increased attendance.

School spirit and sportsmanship go hand in hand. If school spirit is channeled in a positive way, and expectations for good sportsmanship are communicated

and enforced by school administrators, positive fan experiences will occur.

A survey several years ago by Varsity Brands concluded that high school students with school spirit performed better academically, were more engaged in social and civic matters, and were happier in general than their less-spirited peers.

The survey indicated that the benefits of school spirit are not just confined to the school years. The study suggested that school spirit can have lasting effects, including higher aspirations for continuing education and greater success in later life.

We are pleased to report that Varsity has commissioned a new research study, which will examine the post-pandemic educational landscape and attempt to understand how the return to in-person schooling has influenced school spirit and its profound impact on student learning, leadership and personal growth. We look forward to sharing the results of this survey down the road.

As the calendar turns to 2024, it is a great opportunity to renew commitments to these programs that involve more than 12 million participants in sports and performing arts programs that foster and celebrate school spirit.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2024

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 35 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2023-24 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2024-25 school year. This year, a total of 1,607 applications from 445 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Baksetball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.





With the addition of this class, members will have represented 137 schools from 50 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 16 MHSAA sports, and all eight will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

MHSAA Representative Council

he Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.




