

2024 FINALS REVIEW

CRANES TAKE TITLE IN 30T THRILLER

n one of Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook Kingswood's least likely championship hockey teams, one of the least likely players was the hero.

Junior defenseman David Schmitt's fourth goal of the season 3:34 into the third overtime gave the Cranes their 19th MHSAA Finals championship with a 3-2 victory over East Grand Rapids in the 2024 Division 3 title game at USA Hockey Arena.

Schmitt scored from the right point off a faceoff win. It was his second goal of the game and third in two games over the weekend.

"I just went blank," he said. "Did I do that? It was pretty crazy."

Prior to the MHSAA Semifinals, Schmitt had only one goal and four assists in 28 games.

"Coaches were telling me to get pucks off quick on net and see what'll happen," Schmitt said. "I did. I saw a lane, shot it and it went in.

"It's incredible, but it's not just me. It's the team, everybody, the coach, our goalie. Everybody put in equally as much work. I can't say enough about these guys. It's an incredible team."

Cranbrook-Kingswood came into the MHSAA playoffs unranked and completely under the radar, which was understandable given its 11-13-1 regular-season record. And it had been three years since the Cranes' last Finals championship, their record 18th.

Players and coaches believe the team finally began to gel about a month ago.

"I think it starts at the top with leadership on the team," Cranes senior Michael Horton said. "I remember coach (John) LaFontaine saying at the beginning of the year and throughout the year (that we'll struggle) if the leadership on this team cannot come together, because the younger guys will see that and they'll just be like, 'Oh, our seniors, our leaders, our whatevers, they don't trust each other, so how are we supposed to trust them? How are we supposed to





trust this process?' Before every overtime, before every play, we'd go up to each other and say, 'I trust you. I trust you with everything I have."

The championship doesn't happen without the stellar goaltending of junior Garrett Dudlar, who joined the team around Christmas and made 53 saves, the second-most in an MHSAA Final. The record of 58 was set by Orchard Lake St. Mary's Ryan Morley-Stockton in an eight-overtime 1-1 tie with Marquette in the 2008 Division 1 title game.

Dudlar stopped the final 39 shots he faced.

"It was definitely different," Dudlar said of playing triple overtime. "We played a solid game so far, so nothing changed; keep it the same."

East Grand Rapids senior Glenn Green opened the game by scoring the fastest goal to start a Final, just 12 seconds after the opening faceoff. The previous record of 18 seconds was set by East Kentwood's Jason Bravata against Trenton in the 1990 Class A Final.

Kyle Braunscheidel responded for the Cranes by the 4:14 mark. The Pioneers took a 2-1 lead into the intermission after James Albers scored on the power play at 15:39 of the first.

Schmitt scored the only goal of the second period just three seconds into a two-man advantage at 8:28.

For the Pioneers, it was the second year in a row they lost in gut-wrenching fashion in the championship game. In 2023, they lost 3-2 to Flint Powers Catholic when Mason Czarnecki scored on a breakaway with 4.6 seconds left for the latest winning goal in regulation time in Finals history.

"There's, what, 142 teams in the state?" East Grand Rapids coach Christopher Newton asked. "Not many people are able to win, trying to get through a season and set high goals. We had that group. It doesn't come around very much, so it's really disappointing."

BYRON CENTER NOT TO BE DENIED A THIRD TIME

This time, nobody was going to jam home a rebound with 6.7 seconds left to crush their dreams.

This time, there wasn't a Peter Rosa around to don a Superman cape and score a third-period hat trick to rip a championship from their hands.

Byron Center had its own Superman this time, ensuring the Bulldogs wouldn't be victims of another team's storybook ending again.

Senior forward Jackson Froysland completed his hat trick 1 minute, 10 seconds into the third period to give Byron Center a four-goal cushion in a 6-1 victory over Trenton in the 2024 MHSAA Division 2 championship game at USA Hockey Arena.

Few teams have suffered the degree of multiple heartbreaking losses on the Finals stage as Byron Center.

In 2021, the Bulldogs lost 2-1 to Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice when Alec Hamady scored with 6.7 seconds left.

In 2023, Byron Center took a 2-0 lead into the third period. That's when Rosa solidified his legacy at Brother Rice by scoring three goals in the Warriors' 4-2 victory, a game in which Roman Villaire scored the game-winner with 4:42 left.

Knowing there would be no soul-crushing drama this time around, players on Byron Center's bench began celebrating with 1:43 left in the game.

"We've been thinking about that for a whole year," Froysland said. "Coming into that locker room after the second period, we knew what they were going to come out and do. We countered that pretty well, I'd say."

Froysland has been as instrumental as any player in the rise of Byron Center's co-op hockey program from its beginnings in 2016-17. With three goals and one assist against Trenton, Froysland finished his three-year career with 72 goals and 98 assists in 88 games.



Senior lineman Cade Pratt has been just as integral to the Bulldogs' success. With two goals and two assists in the Final, he extended his points streak to 35 games going back to the final five games of 2023. He finished this season with 34 goals and 54 assists in 30 games.

In 2023, Pratt's goal in the first period gave Byron Center the 2-0 lead it carried into the third period against Brother Rice.

"Throughout the whole season, we'd touch on it here and there," Pratt said. "When you go in 2-0 and lose, it burns you. Going into the third period of this game, it was a little reminiscent of that game. We knew what we had to do."

After two near misses, the Bulldogs became only the third Grand Rapids-area team to win an MHSAA hockey championship. East Kentwood won Class A in 1990, and Grand Rapids Catholic Central captured Division 3 in 2011.

CATHOLIC CENTRAL NOTCHES NO. 5 IN A ROW

At any point, **Mathieu Chernauckas** (right) could have looked for a way out. As a junior at Detroit Catholic Central, he was still a goaltender on the junior varsity hockey team, separated from the glory that comes with being on the perennial MHSAA championship varsity squad.

There were no guarantees he would ever play on the varsity, let alone see much ice time. But he kept plugging away, first by making the varsity, then by winning a three-man battle for the starting position midway through the 2023-24 season.

His patience and determination paid off when he stopped all 25 shots he faced in a 2-0 victory over Brighton in the 2024 MHSAA Division 1 Final at USA Hockey Arena.

"I just love a story like that, because he didn't get anything given to him as a freshman," Catholic Central coach Brandon Kaleniecki said. "He had to wait three years just to have a chance to be on the team. You love the persistence and you love to see a guy like that get rewarded. You could see how excited his teammates were for him. That tells me a lot."

Chernauckas was in a goaltending rotation early in the season with juniors Joe Bedells and Bobby Brandt before seizing the starting job by midseason. He finished the season with a 21-1 record, a 1.19 goals against average and a .937 save percentage.

"It was the most fun hockey season of my life," Chernauckas said. "I couldn't ask for anything more. It was difficult (at first). I wasn't going to start the first couple games. I got my chance. I took advantage of it, and I went from there."

It was the fifth-straight MHSAA Finals championship for the Shamrocks and the third in a row defeating Brighton in the title game.

There have been Finals in which it didn't seem to matter who was between the pipes for Catholic Central, which dominated puck possession more often than not. But this was an even battle against a perennial Division 1 contender, one in which the Shamrocks held a slim 28-25 advantage in shots. They needed Chernauckas to be strong in net to secure this one.

"The big crowd, the atmosphere, those big guns they have are always dangerous and they created some chances," Kaleniecki said. "He had to make some big saves. We had to block some shots. We had to gut it out."


The Shamrocks opened the scoring at 10:56 of the first period when Joseph Curtin buried a shot from the top of the right circle on the power play. It remained 1-0 until Cael Rogowski pounced on a turnover in front of the Brighton net, took a shot, then knocked in his rebound with 13:45 left in the game.

The last team to beat Catholic Central in the postseason was Brighton in the 2018 Semifinals.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2025

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 36 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2024-25 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2025-26 school year. This year, a total of 1,513 applications from 431 schools were received for 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Baksetball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.







Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

ight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2024-25 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of MHSAA championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to serve on the Student Advisory Council in 2024-25 are: Itzel Albarran, Bronson; Harper Barnhart, Brownstown Woodhaven; Diamond Cook, Southfield Christian; Henry Ewles, Pontiac Notre Dame Prep; Cole Haist, Big Rapids; Frannie Keeley, Jenison; Trey LaValley, Romeo; and Ethan Stine, Bridgman.

Those eight new members were selected from 90 applicants. The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 142 schools from 51 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 10 MHSAA sports, and five will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.

This school year, the Council handed out championship trophies at Finals events, led sessions during four Sportsmanship Summits and provided assistance at the

he Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, non-public schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.



MICHIGAN ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP



Michigan high school seniors and students who recently graduated from high school may be eligible for the Michigan Achievement Scholarship.

Community College Guarantee

All students are eligible for the Community College Guarantee (regardless of family income), which includes:

- Earning a skills certificate or associate degree tuition-free at their indistrict community college!*
- An additional \$1,000 Michigan Achievement Bonus for Pell-eligible students to use toward additional college costs.

Public or Private University

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a Public or Private University.

- Up to \$27,500 to earn a bachelor's degree—that's \$5,500 per year for up to five years.
- 7 in 10 high school graduates are eligible.
- Find out if you are eligible by completing the FAFSA.

Career Training

Students may be eligible to receive the Michigan Achievement Scholarship at a career training program.

- Up to \$4,000 to earn a skill certificate—that's \$2,000 per year for up to two years.
- Find out if your program is eligible by visiting michigan.gov/careertraining.

*Students would receive a significant tuition discount if they attend an out-of-district community college.
