Rangers Ride Seniors to Top

The Grand Rapids Forest Hills Central boys lacrosse seniors played in the Division 2 championship game all four years of their high school careers.

Safe to say, 2019's capper was tops.

Senior **Tate Hallock** (below) scored five goals and assisted on four others, and fellow senior Luke Majick added five goals and three assists as the Rangers overwhelmed a young Ada Forest Hills Eastern squad 20-4 at Parker Field in Howell.



The championship was the fourth in program history, joining one in 2016 when these seniors were freshmen. The next two years, the Rangers fell short to East Grand Rapids – by two goals in 2017 and by one in double overtime a year later.

"It feels amazing," Hallock said. "Obviously, sophomore and junior year we didn't get it, and freshman year we got it but I wasn't able to play. So just taking it all in, and it's amazing that I finally played, got some goals and was able to contribute."

The Rangers finished the year 22-1, their lone loss to Division 1 champion Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice. Eastsern, meanwhile, went 16-7 in their first season under coach Zack Grusell, who was offensive coordinator for Central in 2015.

"It's amazing," Central coach Andy Shira said. "These guys, especially this group of seniors. It's sad to see it end, but it's ending in the best way possible for them."

In six MHSAA Tournament games, Central held each opponent to five goals or fewer and never scored fewer than 17 goals.

After a first quarter that saw both teams tentative – despite being familiar with one another after a 17-4 Central victory over Eastern in April – the Rangers opened the scoring gates in the second quarter and never looked back. Sophomore Carson Deines and Hallock both scored in the opening quarter to give Central a 2-0 lead that grew to seven by the 4:28 mark of the second quarter. Majick scored goals 13 seconds apart in the second, and his third of the quarter put Central ahead 7-0.

Division 1 – Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice 14, Detroit Catholic Central 13

Justin Glod recalls vividly the feeling of watching another team celebrate a Division 1 lacrosse championship in 2018.

He wasn't about to endure that pain again with his senior season winding down.

With his Bloomfield Hills Brother Rice team trailing by one against reigning champion Detroit Catholic Central and the clock ticking precariously close to zero, Glod scored the tying goal with 1:55 left in regulation. He followed it with the championship-winner with one second left at Parker Field in Howell to complete the Warriors' fourth perfect season in school history and add a 14th championship trophy in 15 seasons.

When Glod's game-winner crossed the goal line to put his team ahead 14-13, he was chased down and mobbed by teammates.

"I turned back to the crowd, put my hands up. It was the best feeling in the world," Glod said. "I saw my teammates run after me. It was incredible. We went from the lowest of the lows to the highest of the highs."

Brother Rice finished a perfect 23-0 with three victories over Catholic Central, the last one a back-and-forth affair that could have gone either way. Catholic Central's season ended at 20-4 a year after wresting the championship away from Brother Rice in an 11-10 final. It was the fifth runner-up finish for Catholic Central over the last six seasons.

Catholic Central took a 13-12 lead with 2:29 to play on Joey Kamish's sixth goal of the game, on an assist from fellow senior Ryan Birney.

It marked just the third Catholic Central goal of the second half after the Shamrocks netted 10 in the first half.

Glod then tied the game with a shot from a sharp angle, and the Warriors got the all-important possession on the ensuing faceoff, milking the clock until there were 15 seconds left. A missed shot with eight seconds to play set up Glod's heroics.



"Those last 3 minutes, I was kind of in shock," Glod said. "It's been an incredible ride. Ever since the day after the last state championship game, we got at it. We had this in mind the whole year. We knew we were going to get back here and knew we had to do everything we could to win this game, and it happened."





Scholar-Athlete Class of 2021

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 32 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2020-21 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2021-22 school year. This year, a total of 1,356 applications from 418 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored in a virtual ceremony later this spring. Details and a video of the ceremony will be posted on MHSAA.com.


Those eight new members were selected from a record-high 179 applicants, twice as many as generally apply for SAC positions every year.

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
