If Game Goes To Overtime

Football Overtime Rules

During each overtime in high school football, each team gets an offensive series – First and Goal from the 10-yard line - and one time out. Time outs left over from regulation play don't carry over. The only way a team can pick up a first down is on a roughing foul. A lost fumble or intercepted pass ends a team's series – the defense cannot return the ball. A coin toss starts the process, and then the choices alternate with additional overtimes – a second coin flip is not use. And unlike college football, there is never a requirement that a team go for a two-point conversion.
