Shrine Time!



Royal Oak Shrine Catholic girls soccer coach Mark Soma knew when he made a promise to Chloe Woodbeck, he'd have to do his best to keep it.

In 2019 at DeMartin Stadium, the coach made good on his assurance to his star senior. His Knights scored a pair of goals in each half en route to a dominating 4-0 victory over Kalamazoo Christian in the Division 4 championship game, bringing home the school's first team championship in any sport since 1974.

"I took the chance and I came out and played," Woodbeck said, "and I'm so happy I did. It's amazing to be out here with my classmates. It's something I've never been able to do before. I'm so happy I can end my high school career doing this."

Woodbeck attended Shrine but only played club soccer until 2019, and she got things going for the Knights. She capitalized on a free kick with 24:11 to play in the first half. Drawing the penalty just moments earlier, Woodbeck sent a shot curling up and over Kalamazoo Christian goalkeeper Jenna Blackwell's outstretched hands to break the ice for her team.

It proved to be the game-winning goal. But it was just the start for a potent Shrine team. Just under 11 minutes after Woodbeck's score, junior Lily Hotts took a cross from junior Jess Reaume and redirected it for a 2-0 lead.

As good as the Knights' offense was, it might have been an even more impressive showing by their defense with the play of junior goalkeeper Allison LaPoint. Trailing by a goal with just under 17 minutes to play in the first half, Kalamazoo Christian junior Lauryn Mohney broke in down the right side. She took a shot from 12 yards out but was thwarted by LaPoint, who made a diving save to her left. LaPoint did the same with 27:30 left in the second half and the Knights leading 2-0. Again it was Mohney on another breakaway. And again, it was LaPoint who made a diving save to preserve the two-goal cushion.

"I rely a lot on my defense because they're amazing and I trust them. But it is important to be able to make those key saves in tough situations like that," said LaPoint, who finished the game with four saves.

Shrine (23-3-3) fed off of the defensive energy, scoring to make it 3-0 just five minutes later. It was freshman Bridgette Drouillard who gave Shrine the three-goal lead, taking a crossing pass from Hotts and punching it home.

Shrine capped off the scoring with 10:24 remaining as junior Regan Robinson drilled a shot from 30 yards out.

DIVISION 1: Novi 5, Plymouth 0

Scoring goals in a championship game is never easy. But Novi sure made it look that way in the 2019 Division 1 title game at DeMartin Stadium. The Wildcats had four players score at least once – including senior Jessie Bandyk, who netted two – and cruised past Plymouth, 5-0, to take home their second straight Finals championship.

The five goals were the most that have been scored in a Division 1 championship game.

"These seniors, knowing that this was their last game, they were given a gift," Novi head coach Todd Pheiffer said. "When you start the state tournament, you never know when your last practice is going to be. You show up for the game the next day, you hope you win and get to practice the next day."

Novi wrapped up an unbeaten season, finishing 28-0-1, becoming just the second team in state history – along with Hudsonville Unity Christian in 2006 – to win 28 games and finish unbeaten.

The Wildcats allowed just eight goals this season and picked up 23 shutouts – the second most in state history. On Saturday, they allowed just five shots, two on goal. They outshot Plymouth 25-5..

DIVISION 2: Bloomfield Hills Marian 2, Forest Hills Northern 1 (OT)

For all the success the Bloomfield Hills Marian soccer team has enjoyed over the last two decades, the 2019 Division 2 Final offered a chance to achieve two things for the first time.

One, Marian won three consecutive championships for the first time in school history with a thrilling 2-1 overtime win over Grand Rapids Forest Hills Northern. All three of those titles have come via victories over Forest Hills Northern in the title game.

Second, MSU's DeMartin Stadium provided a new venue for Marian to win its eighth title since 2003. Marian had won its titles in Richland, Grand Rapids, Troy and Williamston, but never had appeared in a Final held at MSU.

"The last time we won two in a row, we got knocked out on the first night (of the playoffs)," Marian head coach Barry Brodsky said. "There have only been two Marian players since I've been here that have won three state championships. Now, we have seven or eight who have just joined those two."

The game-winner came with 4:18 remaining in the second period of overtime, off Marian's 12th corner kick of the game.

Marian senior Sara Stroud delivered the ball into the box, and amidst a flurry of bodies, sophomore Maria Askounis put the ball into the net to make it 2-1 Marian.

"My coaches told me to stay at the far post, and so I stayed on the far post," Askounis said. "That's where the ball went, and I just tapped it in. It feels amazing."

DIVISION 4: GR South Christian 3, Essexville Garber 0

Grand Rapids South Christian senior goalkeeper Annika Zuverink said that throughout the spring, head coach Brian Broekhuizen brought the team bagels every time she and the Sailors shut out an opponent.

But toward the end of the season, Zuverink said Broekhuizen started bringing something else to reward a scoreless performance.

"He's upgraded to cheeseburgers now," Zuverink said.

Whatever the choice of food, it was bagels and cheeseburgers for all on South Christian's squad again following the Division 3 Final at Michigan State University's DeMartin Field.

The Sailors recorded their 20th shutout of the season and had plenty of offense to flank their stout defense, scoring twice in the first half en route to a 3-0 victory over Essexville Garber.

It was the second title in school history for the Sailors, who also won it all in 2013. South Christian didn't allow a single goal over its seven playoff games.

The victory also served as a milestone win for Broekhuizen, who won his 100th game as head coach of the South Christian program.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2021

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 32 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2020-21 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2021-22 school year. This year, a total of 1,356 applications from 418 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored in a virtual ceremony later this spring. Details and a video of the ceremony will be posted on MHSAA.com.



Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

he Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year earlier.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2020-21 are: Brinlee Barry, Caledonia; Faith Breinager, Frankenmuth; Amina Ferris, Dearborn; Nico Johnson, Britton Deerfield; Brenna Kosal, Peck; Ashton McNabb, Three Oaks River Valley; Brock Porter, Orchard Lake St. Mary's; and Melik Williams, Ypsilanti Lincoln.

Those eight new members were selected from a record-high 179 applicants, twice as many as generally apply for SAC positions every year.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 117 schools from 45 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The MHSAA Representative Council

he Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
