# Rangers Rule



Wearing her black "lucky" jacket, Forest Hills Central girls soccer coach Ashley Ludtke celebrated her team's 2-1 MHSAA Division 2 championship game victory over Bloomfield Hills Marian in 2022 at MSU's DeMartin Stadium.

The Mustangs were seeking their fifth-straight Division 2 title. Instead, the Rangers (20-2-1) ended that streak with their fifth championship and first since winning Division 1 in 2017.

FHC became just the fifth team to hold Marian to fewer than two goals this season, and capped a run during which it didn't give up more than one goal in 10 straight games.

"Marian is obviously a top-notched program," Ludtke said. "They have skilled players at every level. Our defense really came together the final part of the season."

The Rangers offense was led all season by senior forward Theryn Hallock, and she wasted no time making her presence felt, scoring the first goal on a header at the 35:01 mark to give Central a 1-0 lead. It was her 35th goal of the season.

Boxing out like a power forward, she made the Marian defense account for her throughout the championship. Hallock returned to the soccer field this spring for the first time since middle school after focusing on hoops during her first three years at FHC.

After Hallock's goal, Marian star Isa Agrusso took less than two minutes to tie the game, fighting through two defenders and scoring her 21st goal of the season.

The tie didn't last long as senior midfielder Stella Sutton scored on a corner kick at the 31:15 mark to give the Rangers a 2-1 advantage.

"We've been working on corner kicks ever since postseason started," said Sutton. "I really just wanted to get in there and capitalize on the opportunity. I got my body in there. It hit my shoulder and it just went in. It determined the game. We knew we couldn't allow another goal."

They didn't.

The Mustangs (17-2) pressed the issue offensively looking for the tying score, but lime green-clad FHC keeper Ava Wilberding was up to the challenge.

Hallock nearly gave the Rangers a 3-1 lead, but a shot that got through came just after the first-half horn sounded.

Bloomfield Hills Marian (17-2) was seeking its fifth-straight Division 2 title, but this time for the first time without retired coach Barry Brodsky.

#### DIVISION 1: Bloomfield Hills 2, Northville 1 (Shootout)

Ava Badallo momentarily made her dream come true by scoring in the first half of the 2022 MHSAA Division 1 soccer championship game.

But an offsides penalty nullified what would have been a rare goal against one of the state's stinglest defenses.

Undaunted, the Bloomfield Hills senior forward did score off a great assist from Brooke Green at 5:44 into the second half – just the eighth goal Northville had given up all season.

Ultimately the game went to a shootout, and it was one more Badallo goal that put Bloomfield Hills up 4-1 and clinched an overall 2-1 victory over the previously-unbeaten Mustangs – the Black Hawks' their first Finals championship in girls soccer.

Jenica Opdahl, Bloomfield Hills' sophomore keeper, said she used a ploy to confuse the Northville shooters.

"I stood to one side leaving one side of the net wide open," she said. "So, I knew they were going to shoot it that way. It worked."

Drew Martin, Esther Rosett and Emma Merchant scored during the shootout before Badallo's clincher. Caroline Meloche scored Northville's shootout goal.

The Mustangs' Kate Gonzalez got Northville tied the game at 5:27 of the second half to set up the overtime.

#### DIVISION 3: Williamston 3, Hudsonville Unity Christian 2

Williamston made its third appearance in an MHSAA Girls Soccer Final last June. And for the third time, the Hornets were seeking their first championship against longtime powerhouse Hudsonville Unity Christian.

Williamston had lost Finals to the Crusaders in overtime in 2008 and 1-0 in 2010. But consider any lingering Unity night-mares over for the Hornets.

Junior Breyer Fenech blasted in a shot off an assist from Kaley Douglass with 1:21 to play as Williamston pulled out a heart-stopping 3-2 victory.

"Kaley put it right on my foot," said Fenech. "I kind of saw Kaley coming down and I saw an opening and I called for the ball, she was able to get it through and I put it away."

Said Douglass: "It was all her. If she hadn't gotten my attention, I probably wouldn't have known she was there. She was the one that finished it, and I'm so thankful she did."

The Hornets (17-2-1) entered the postseason ranked No. 1 in Division 1, and Unity Christian (21-2-1) was ranked No. 2.

The goal of the game was a 45-yard blast from senior midfielder Liz Bellinger, a free kick that landed in the right corner of the Unity net with just 10 minutes left to tie the game 2-2.

"It brought a lot of energy; I wasn't even expecting that," said Bellinger. "I was just trying to get one in there. I think it did bring our energy up."

#### DIVISION 4: Royal Oak Shrine 1, Kalamazoo Christian 0

For Royal Oak Shrine Catholic, the disappointment of 2021's 5-0 MHSAA Division 4 Soccer Final loss to North Muskegon now can be replaced with 2022's impressive 1-0 shutout of Kalamazoo Christian.

After a scoreless first half, junior Norah Tisko scored 25 seconds into the second on a header to give the Knights (16-4-2) a 1-0 lead. It was her seventh goal of the season, with the assist going to Bridgette Drouillard.

"Yes, I had the finish, but it was our defense," said Tisko. "Ava Gappy working it up the midfield and giving the ball to Julia (Bock), and Bridgette just giving me the most beautiful ball to execute. I really can't take credit for it."

With nine shutouts coming into the Final, paced by sophomore goalkeeper Elena Gallagher, the Knights were used to shutting down opposing offenses.

Shrine had allowed just one goal during the playoffs, during a 9-1 victory over St. Joseph Our Lady of the Lake in the Regional Final. The finale was the Knights' sixth shutout of the tournament.

# **Scholar-Athlete Class of 2023**

he Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 34 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2022-23 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2023-24 school year. This year, a total of 1,440 applications from 421 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients were honored during the MHSAA Boys Baksetball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.



## **Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA**

ight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2023-24 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2023-24 are: Cale Bell, Sault Ste. Marie; Drew Cady, Oxford; Macy Jenkins, Milford; Isaiah Kabban, Harbor Beach; Ella Knudsen, Leland; Kaylee Kranz, Clinton; Joey Spada, Kalamazoo Central; and Aynalem Zoet, Grandville Calvin Christian.

Those eight new members were selected from 105 applicants. That number of applicants was the fourth-most ever, with the last four years featuring the four highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 137 schools from 50 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 16 MHSAA sports, and all eight will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic programs. There also is a fifth S discussed by the group – student leadership.



# The MHSAA Representative Council

he Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
