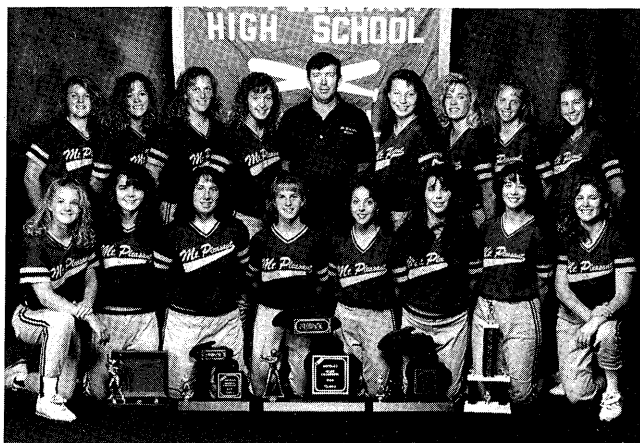

FINAL GAME NOTES: This contest was the longest for a championship game in MHSAA history. It began on Saturday, June 19, before being suspended in the top of the 15th inning after heavy rains made conditions unplayable at Battle Creek's Bailey Park. Sunny skies greeted the teams Monday, but pitchers Angie Rosich for Pinconning and Lisa Hillman for Fenton continued their dominance. Pinconning finally broke through in the 20th inning, getting its only run when Kassie Mark scored on a two-out single by Dana Bersano. Mark singled with one out and went to second on a sacrifice bunt by Kim Seyuin to set up Bersano's game-winning hit. Bersano's game-winning hit was her third of the contest, tying a final contest record. Rosich struck out 32 Fenton batters to set a final game mark. The previous mark was 21, set in a 17-inning game by Kelly Forbis of Milford Lakeland High School in the 1989 Class A Championship contest against Harper Woods Regina. That 17-inning affair was also the previous mark for longest contest.
