ADMISSION

- Admission is \$11 per person **per session**. MHSAA will provide tickets digitally via GoFan only; there are no on-site ticket sales and no cash sales.
- Purchase of admission does not guarantee facility re-entry.

AWARDS

- At the Finals session, the fastest sixteen athletes for each individual event, the top sixteen divers, and the fastest four relay teams earn medals.
- Awards presentations occur between events at the Finals session according to the Schedule of Events.
- Trophies for first through fourth places will be awarded to the teams earning the top four highest overall scores.

BREAKS

Prelims Session – Friday

- 10-minute break after the 200 Yard Medley Relay, before the first heat of the 200 Yard Freestyle
- 15-minute break between the last heat of the 50 Yard Freestyle, before the first heat of the 100 Yard Butterfly
- 10-minute break between the last heat of the 200 Yard Freestyle Relay, before the first heat of the 100 Yard Backstroke

Finals Session - Saturday

- 10-minute break after the 200 Yard Medley Relay, before the first heat of the 200 Yard Freestyle
- 15-minute break at the conclusion of Diving, before the first heat of the 100 Yard Butterfly
- 10-minute break after the 200 Yard Freestyle Relay, before the first heat of the 100 Yard Backstroke

CONCESSIONS

- Concessions will be available between 10:00am and 5:00pm from Little Caesars Pizza, Kona Ice, and Tom's Coffee.

DECK PASSES

Athletes

- Deck passes will be issued to all qualifying athletes by the Meet Host (EMU). These must always be visible when on-deck.
- Athlete Deck Passes may not be used for access into the spectator seating area.

Coaches

- Two Coach passes will be issued to each team, plus one additional Coach pass for those teams with a qualified diver.

Team Managers

- One Manager pass will be issued to teams with more than 5 qualifiers.

- Additional Coach or Manager passes may be purchased at the Registration Table by the Head Coach (only) for \$20 per pass.

DIVING SHEETS

- Diving sheets will not be included in the Meet Packet that coaches will receive at check-in Friday.
- **Confirmation and sign-off of final dive lists must be made not later than 2:30pm on Friday, November 21, 2025 at the Administrative Table.**
- Please do not submit diving sheets to the Meet Manager; all Diving lists will be generated on-site via eDive.

ENTRIES

Coaches are accountable for submitting entries according to the following protocols.

Deadlines

- All swim and dive entries are **due not later than Monday, November 17, 2025 at 12:00pm.**
- Although divers enter the State Meet automatically based on Regional Results, they **MUST** be included in the Hy-Tek Meet Entry file. Teams submitting diver(s) apart from the Hy-Tek file may incur a late fee, at the discretion of the Meet Administrator.

Entry Submissions

- Submit entries to Meet Manager Bill Case via email at billcasemi@gmail.com.
- All event entries must be submitted using the Hy-Tek entry file available from the MHSAA website (<https://www.mhsaa.com>).
- Entries must include:
 - Athlete first and last name and grade (in number format 9-12)
 - School abbreviation matching the one listed on the MHSAA website
 - Coach name(s) and telephone number(s)

Entry Confirmation

- The Meet Administrator will email confirmation of entry receipt, including a list of entries, not later than Tuesday, November 18, 2025 at 12:00pm.
- **Coaches must submit changes, if any, not later than Tuesday, November 18, 2025 at 9:00pm.** Corrections made after this deadline may incur a late fee, at the discretion of the Meet Manager.
- **No changes to entries are permitted after 12:00pm on Wednesday, November 19, 2025.**

FACILITY RULES

- **EMU is not responsible for lost or stolen property**
- Public Locker Rooms (Men's & Women's) are provided. Private restrooms and changing areas are also available. Attaching personal locks to lockers is not permitted. **DECK CHANGING IS FORBIDDEN.**

- **Athletes are required to shower before entering the pool**, to protect water/air quality. No oil or rub down solutions are permitted. No rub down tables are permitted on deck without the approval of the Facility Manager. No shaving is permitted on site.
- **The following items are forbidden** in locker rooms and on-deck:
 - Noisemakers (including music speakers)
 - Flash photography
 - Glass containers
 - Food (food may be consumed in the Rec/IM Building lobby and atrium. Beverages are permitted on deck)
 - Balloons

HOSPITALITY

- On-deck hospitality will be provided for coaches and officials only; no athletes are permitted in the Hospitality Area.
- A Team Hospitality Area is available in Room 126 in the Rec/IM. Teams wishing to bring their own food for their team may store their food in this room.

MHSAA Rules according to the 2025-2026 NFHS Swimming & Diving Rule Book apply to this meet.

PARALYMPIC EVENTS

Paralympic events 50 Yard Freestyle and 100 Yard Freestyle (if entered) will swim at the Saturday Final session, prior to the associated Championship event (see Schedule of Events). Paralympic award presentations follow each Paralympic event.

PARKING / FACILITY ENTRANCE

Buses

- Buses are not permitted in most parking lots. Please unload all buses at the main entrance, then park at the George Gervin Game Above Center at 799 N. Hewitt Rd, Ypsilanti Michigan 48197.

Spectator Vehicles

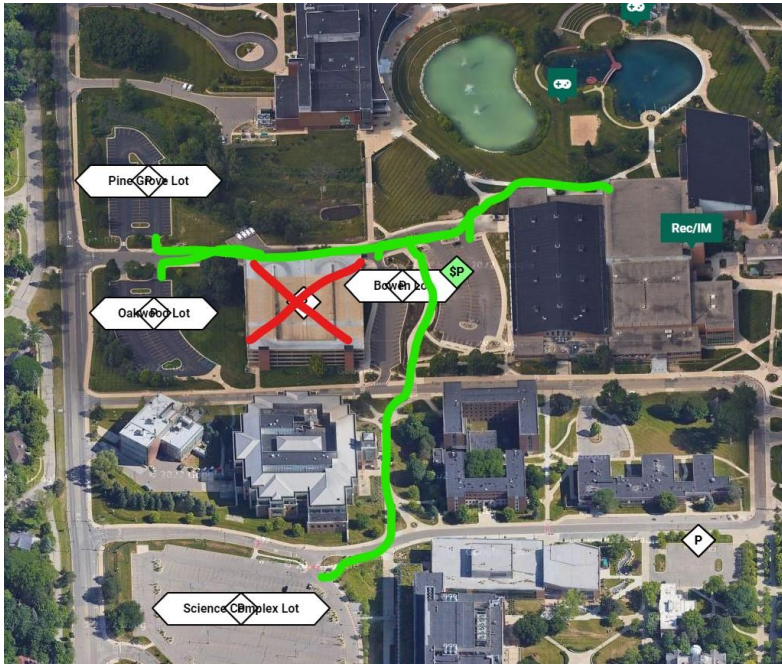

PROGRAMS

- Programs at both Prelims and Finals sessions will be available for \$5.00 each.

PSYCH SHEETS

- Psych sheet will be posted on the MHSAA website not later than Wednesday, November 19th at 12:00pm.
- Psych sheets will include relay names, including alternates.

RELAY ATHLETE / ORDER CHANGES

Changes to relay participants, or to the order in which they swim, may be made no later than the commencement of the first heat of the relay event. Changes must be recorded in one of the following ways:

- By notifying the Meet Administrator (preferred), or
- By noting the change(s) on the appropriate Lane Timer Sheet, including notation of the time by a Lane Timer.

RELAY CARDS

Distribution

- Prelims: Blank Relay Cards will be distributed with your Coaches Packet at the beginning of Warm-Up.
- Finals: Blank Relay Cards will be distributed at the Administrative Table at the beginning of Warm-Up.

Deadlines

Completed Relay Cards are due back to the Administrative Table as specified below:

- 200 Medley Relay: Not later than the end of the Coaches Meeting
- 200 Freestyle Relay: Not later than the beginning of the 100 Yard Butterfly event
- 400 Freestyle Relay: Not later than the conclusion of the 500 Yard Freestyle event

All Relay Cards must be returned to the Administrative Table by the deadline, even if there are no changes from the original entry. Entries with missing and/or incomplete Relay Cards will be scratched from the event.

SAFETY / FIRST AID

- Lifeguards are trained to handle water emergencies and first aid on deck.
- Only authorized individuals may be on-deck (deck pass required).
 - Athletes may enter through the locker rooms
 - Coaches may enter the pool deck via specified entrances
 - **Coaches must always accompany athletes on deck and at practice lanes**
- No diving is permitted in the lanes between the floating bulkhead and the scoreboard (dedicated warm-up / practice lanes). Diving into the competition pool is permitted only during events or at specified times in specified lanes during Warm-up periods.
- Only divers entered in the meet are permitted on the diving boards. **No access to diving platforms is permitted without permission from the Facility Manager.**
- Only approved Meet Personnel are permitted at the Administrative Table and in the Pool Office.
- Direct Safety or First Aid questions or concerns to the Facility Manager.

SCORING

- Scoring will be kept for the Finals session only, with points awarded to the top sixteen (16) finishers for all events as follows (from first to sixteenth place):
 - Individual events: 20, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 9, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1
 - Relay events: 40, 34, 32, 30, 28, 26, 24, 22, 18, 14, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 2
- Overall team scores will determine final overall rankings. In the event of a tie final score, both teams will share the tied ranking, with subsequent rankings renumbered accordingly.

SEATING (SPECTATORS)

Spectator seating is offered on an event session first-come basis. Saving seats is not permitted. Unsafe or unruly behavior in the spectator area may result in expulsion from the facility. No folding/camp chairs are permitted in the spectator area.

SEATING (TEAMS)

Team seating will be provided on the pool deck on a first-come basis for each session. **Team areas must be cleaned, and all belongings must be removed following each session.** The items left after any session will be placed in Lost and Found.

- Small bag/camping chairs are permitted on deck within designated areas (no large “lounge” chairs are permitted).
- Keep chairs behind the deck drains (between the wall and the drain) to maintain adequate safety and walking areas around deck.
- Keep locker room doors, emergency exits, behind the diving boards, and areas for staging, awards and officials free of chairs.

SPORTSMANSHIP

- When a student is disqualified during a contest for flagrant or unsportsmanlike conduct, his/her school shall withhold that student for the remainder of that day of competition and for at least the next day of competition for that team.
- When a coach is disqualified during a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct, that coach shall be prohibited by his/her school from coaching for the remainder of that day of competition and from coaching at or attending at least the next day of competition for that coach's team.
- Failure of the school for any reason to enforce Sportsmanship regulations will prohibit the school from entry in the next MHSAA tournament for that sport, or from the remainder of the current tournament if the disqualification occurs during an MHSAA tournament or during the last regular-season contest.
- Disqualifications from one season carry over to the next season in that sport for undergraduates and coaches, or the next season in any sport for seniors. If the playing rules for a sport specify an additional penalty or more rapid progression, or use of such a progression for other violations, the playing rules apply. Any coach who is disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct two or more times during a season, any player who is disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct three or more times during a season, and any coach or player who is ejected for spitting at, hitting, slapping, kicking, pushing or intentionally and aggressively physically contacting an official at any time during that season, is not eligible to participate in the MHSAA tournament for that sport that season. If the tournament disqualifying ejection for that individual occurs during the MHSAA tournament, that player or coach is ineligible for the remainder of that tournament.
- If a team is removed from competition in protest, the contest is forfeited to the opponent and the coach and principal of the removed team must appear before the Executive Committee to indicate why additional action should not be taken. The Executive Committee may also require the appearance of personnel from other schools and game officials. If the coach is ejected from the contest and an assistant coach, or an assigned school representative is not available to continue as the coach the event is terminated and forfeited to the opponent.
- When a contest is interrupted or it ends prematurely because of breakdown of proper sportsmanship and whether or not the on-site officials forfeit the contest to one team, one or both schools may be subjected to any or all, but not limited to, the following: censure, probation with competition, probation without competition, forfeiture, loss of privilege of revenue sharing, expulsion. In addition, it may be required of one or both schools that their coaches and administrators appear before the Executive Committee to indicate why additional action should not be taken.

WARM-UP / COOL-DOWN

- Swimmers may warm-up or cool-down in the lanes between the floating bulkhead and the scoreboard. Diving is not permitted in the warm-up / cool-down area.
