UNIFORM GUIDELINES PROACTIVE CHECK-IN

Athletes may fix their uniforms / tuck in tops before competition begins.

► INVISIBLE ... And OK

Socks; Arm Warmers; HAIR CONTROL; Visor/Cap; Arm Warmers; Waistband Logo; Gloves in HJ & LJ.





► VISIBLE ... And OK

Ski Band; Knit Watch Cap; One Mfg Logo/garment ≤ 2¼ IN SQ; Sunglasses; Medic Alert Bracelet; Sweatband ≤ 2" wide; Jewelry; Wrist Watch; Ball Cap.



► VISIBLE ... But NOT OK

Hazardous Jewelry; Dew Rag; Offensive Temp Body Adornment/Tattoo; Bare Midriff; NO SHOES at the start of a race or during a field event; GLOVES in SP/DT/PV/RELAYS; Tops w/Knots.



FAILURE TO REPORT

A contestant who fails to report before the start of competition shall not be allowed to participate in the event (Rule 4-1-3). Contact the REFEREE.



ATHLETES EXCUSED TO ANOTHER EVENT

- ASK Athletes at check-in if they have other events.
- **→ TIME LIMITS** Know the procedure set by the GAMES COMMITTEE.
- COMMON SENSE must prevail.
- ➡ RE-ORDER FLIGHTS to facilitate athletes competing in other events. Athletes may choose to 1) move ahead in the order of competition or 2) take consecutive trials before being excused.



- **▶ BE PROACTIVE** Allow a teammate or coach to report to a field event and stand by during the time a competitor has left to compete in another event. The stand-in's presence validates the entry of the excused athlete.
- **→ TIME-STAMP TWICE** When excused athlete 1) LEAVES and 2) RETURNS.
- ➡ FINALS DO NOT CALL an athlete who is legally excused to another event.

Continue the competition.

→ The competitor with the best prelim mark may wait until any excused competitors. have taken all their trials to take the FINAL attempt of the competition [Rule 6-2-3].

ATHLETES EXCUSED TO ANOTHER EVENT -- HAS NOT RETURNED



► Shot Put; Discus Throw; Long Jump

If an athlete has not returned & all others have completed trials ... ANNOUNCE: All remaining throws or jumps must be completed.

Example: "In 10 minutes (or another pre-defined time) the venue will close."

► High Jump; Pole Vault

If an athlete has not returned and all others have cleared the height ...

ANNOUNCE: The bar will soon be raised.

Example: "In 5 minutes (or another pre-defined time) the bar will be raised to the next height." NOTE: Unused attempts will be marked as a pass and may be used at the new height.

"James UP" | "William ON DECK" | "Thomas ON HOLD." When they are 'UP,' Competitors must be ready - not getting ready.

- ANNOUNCE & CIRCLE BEST performances after final attempts.
- ANNOUNCE at conclusion order of finish & best performance.
- SEND RESULTS to the Press Box Announcer.

ADVANCING QUALIFIERS TO FINALS

- ▶ DOUBLE-CHECK the score sheet.
- ► CONFIRM the FINALISTS before announcing.
- ▶ SEND FINALS INFO to the Press Box Announcer.
- ► ANNOUNCE → 1) Finalists & top prelim mark. 2) The time at which finals begin.

RE-WRITE the FINALISTS with best prelim mark

on another sheet in the order of finals competition.

▶ Competitors may view video in a coach's box



MANAGING APPEALS / QUESTIONS (ex. Improper attire / implement)

- 1) Record the performance.
- 2) Don't announce results if there is a question/appeal.




