Reese Comeback Nets First Title

s Miley Cyrus' "Party in the USA" rang through the Kellogg Arena speakers last November, the Reese volleyball team put on a show.

The Rockets huddled up, sang and danced near their bench following the second set of their Division 3 Final against Monroe St. Mary Catholic Central. In isolation, it looked like the beginning of a celebration. With context, it was a team looking to regain its identity while in a 0-2 hole.

"You have to fake it until you make it, man," Reese senior setter Aydan Dalak said. "You have to fake it until you make it, and make it look like you're good."

Three sets later, the Rockets replaced dancing with the happiest player pile in Reese volleyball history, as they came back to defeat SMCC 18-25, 19-25, 25-15, 25-21, 16-14 and claim the school's first volleyball Finals title.

"It was just exciting. It was, I think, everything that people want to see when they come to a state championship game," Reese coach Angie Compton said. "We definitely were not ourselves at the beginning, and we loosened up that third set and we just never looked back. It wasn't pretty and it wasn't perfect, and it wasn't without our, 'Oh no, are we going to do this?' moments. But they're just a great group of girls that just got the job done."

The win denied SMCC a third straight Division 3 title, and ended with a back-and-forth final set, which began with each team going on a 5-0 run. The Kestrels took a 9-7 lead during the set, but, outside of the final tally, neither team led by more than one after that.

Reese (35-5-1) clinched the title on the second championship point of the night, as senior Maddi Osantowski and junior Abby Karst combined for a block.

"Honestly, I don't even remember it," Osantowski said. "I just saw her go up and I was like, 'Whatever, let's just try and block this girl and get the game over with.' I was kind of in shock. That was my first block against her the whole game. It was great."

As the tension of the final set increased, Reese continued to stay loose,

lining up as sprinters on the one side of the court as a timeout would come to an end, and faux sprinting across to the other side when the horn would blow. That joined a stirring rendition of "Living on a Prayer" and a team shadow boxing exercise during "Eye of the Tiger" in getting the Rockets into the proper headspace to come out victorious.

"I was like, 'Everybody is probably judging us like crazy. Do they not care?'" Compton said with a laugh. "We expected to win. We came in thinking we could do this. We don't think everybody else thought that, but we don't care. We definitely care, especially in those moments, we care the most when we're loosening ourselves up. When we're dancing and getting loose, we know that's how we play better. I know it looks weird, but it's very important to our style of play."

Also very important to their style of play is Osantowski, who finished with 34 kills and totaled 110 attack attempts during the match.

"I know that she will put it down when we need it to be put down," said Dalak, who had 42 assists on the night. "It's good to mix it up sometimes, too, because we need to get those blockers moving around."

Dalak did switch it up in a crucial moment, ending a wild rally with a dump for the final point of the fourth set. Dalak also had 13 digs and six kills in the match, while Sarah Gray added 21 digs and six kills. Josie Johnson led the Reese defense with 29 digs, while Osantowski added 17.


While Reese was getting loose and gaining momentum, SMCC (36-12) was attempting to regain what it had in the opening two sets.

"A big part of it is, I tell them, 'Take a deep breath, let's focus on the things that we know,'" Kestrels co-coach Cassandra Haut said. "Any way to just kind of refocus on something else, not the nerves or anything else you're feeling."

Senior Kate Collingsworth spread the wealth with her 52 assists for SMCC. Jessica Costlow had 22 kills, McKenna Payne had 21 and Audrey Cousino had 10. Payne also had 29 digs and four aces, while Costlow had 19 digs.

Tigers Roar Back to Top Spot in D4

The state's winningest volleyball program was back to doing what it does best in 2021 – winning consecutive MHSAA Finals. Battle Creek St. Philip won its second-straight Division 4 volleyball title, sweeping Indian River Inland Lakes 25-17, 25-12, 25-8.



"For me, it's just a whole different aspect now, seeing those little girls up in the stands," St. Philip senior Brooke Dzwik said. "That was us at one point. They're going to be the legacy. It's not us anymore, it's them. To win so that they could see means a lot."

St. Philip now has 22 Finals titles, including a record nine straight from 2007-14. St. Philip (40-11-1) entered the postseason ranked No. 3, and defeated No. 2 Athens in the Regional and No. 1 Adrian Lenawee Christian in the Quartersjust to get to Kellogg.

Newcomer Inland Lakes (27-11-11) was coming off its first Regional title since 1995. The Bulldogs didn't seem to be fazed by the moment early on, trading blows with the reigning champions, and even responding to a 4-

0 run midway through the first set with a 4-0 run of its own, tying the score at 16. But following a timeout, St. Philip rattled off eight points in a row to take control and put the first set away.

From there, it was all Tigers, as St. Philip coach Vicki Groat didn't want Inland Lakes to build confidence during the match.

"That's a good team, and watching them on Thursday, there was no intimidation for them," Groat said. "They were playing relaxed, they had nothing to lose. In this stage, if you have them down, you have to keep the momentum going, keep the pressure on until the very end. I thought we did a good job of that today."

Dzwik led the St. Philip attack with 14 kills, but Groat was impressed with how setter Rachel Myers spread the ball around throughout the match. Maddie Hoelscher (five kills), Alexis Snyder (five kills), Alex Kersten (four kills) and Makenzee Grimm (four kills) all helped to keep Inland Lakes off balance.

Natalie Wandrie had five kills and 10 digs to lead Inland Lakes, while Ryann Clancy had 11 digs. Alyssa Byrne finished with eight assists, and Olivia Monthei had four kills.

ND Prep Seniors Go Out with D2 Title

Josie Bloom and her Pontiac Notre Dame Prep senior classmates entered high school with the volleyball program on top. They will leave having put it in the same place.


Led by a deep and talented senior class, the Irish defeated North Branch 25-17, 25-17, 25-12 to claim the 2021 MHSAA Division 2 Finals title.

"It's awesome," Bloom said. "We've had this goal since the beginning of the season, and it's awesome to have that final feeling, and to go out with a bang."

The title is the fourth for the Irish, and first since 2017, when the Class of 2022 was in the 8th grade. Notre Dame Prep advanced to the Final Four in each of the past four seasons, and was a finalist in 2018. But the promise of this class was truly met as it capped off a remarkable 64-1 season by hoisting the Finals trophy.

"It's so hard to do," said Notre Dame Prep coach Betty Wroubel, who has coached all four Finals champions. "I don't think people realize how hard it is to get this far and win. Anything can happen along the way. You need a little bit of luck, you need a lot of skill and you need a team that's going to persevere through adversity no matter what. I think this team's mental toughness was awesome."

Bloom led the Notre Dame Prep defense with 20 digs, while Aly Borellis led the attack with 17 kills and 13 assists. Bianca Giglio added 10 kills, while Margo Sudzina had 19 assists, and Elyssa Wallace had 17 digs. Of that group, only Sudzina, a junior, is not among nine graduating seniors.



While the Irish were senior-led, North Branch (46-9) was led mostly by its sophomore class.

Adrienne Greschaw had 19 assists for North Branch, with Natasha Bickel (seven) and Kaela Chingwa (six) leading the team in kills. Hailey Green had 18 digs for the Broncos, and Alana Deshetsky added 15.

Marian Meets Championship Expectation in Finishing Repeat Run

Winning the 2021 MHSAA Division 1 Volleyball Finals title was the expectation for Bloomfield Hills Marian. Not just on the last Saturday of the season, when that expectation became reality with a 25-18, 22-25, 25-18, 25-19 win against Ann Arbor Skyline. Not just as the postseason began.

That was the expectation from the time the ball was rolled onto the court for the Mustangs' first practice in August.



"Although it was a goal, that never made us get complacent or get lazy," Marian senior and Miss Volleyball winner Ava Brizard said. "We always worked our butts off like we were the underdogs, like we were the last-ranked team in the state; I think that's what really helped us get to this moment right here."

The title was the second straight for Marian, and fourth in program history. The Mustangs rolled through the season as Division 1's top team, going 53-1, and dropping just four regular-season sets.

Marian did not play like a team under pressure, running out to a double-digit lead in the first set and winning comfortably. But Skyline (55-4-2) came roaring back in the second with an attack led by Harper Murray and Cari Bohm, and handed the Mustangs just their fifth set loss of the season.

Marian responded to the rare setback, and while Skyline hung tough for most of the final two sets, Marian simply had too much down the stretch.

Brizard and Murray put on the show they were expected to provide as two of the state's best attackers, each finishing with 25 kills. Brizard was backed by Sophie Treder's nine kills for Marian.





Sportsmanship Extends to Online Behavior

ith the changes that have occurred in college sports the past couple of years, high school sports is truly the last level of pure amateur competition in our country – and the NFHS and its member state associations want it to remain that way.

As football, volleyball, soccer, cross country and other sports begin this fall, high school coaches and athletic/activity directors will be involved in preseason meetings to emphasize the expected outcomes of education-based sports, as well as speech, debate, music, theatre and other programs.

Among those fundamental values of education-based activities that must be discussed is sportsmanship, or good sporting behavior. More than winning, more than learning the skills of a sport, a focus on sportsmanship has been one of the defining elements of high school sports and other activities for more than 100 years.

Along with maintaining the sound traditions of sports and minimizing the risk of injury, NFHS playing rules encourage sportsmanship, and the first page in all NFHS rules publications includes a statement noting that "each athlete is responsible for exercising caution and good sportsmanship."

In the past, with an emphasis on conduct on the playing field or court – or in the auditorium or rehearsal hall – sportsmanship has been defined as those qualities of behavior that are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others. More so than preparing students to play sports or another activity at the next level, one of the significant goals of education-based high school sports and activities is helping the 12 million-plus individuals in these programs to become responsible citizens.

And in today's online world dominated by handheld devices, that goal has become more challenging. Now, messages to students in high school sports and other activities about sportsmanship must be communicated before they hit the practice field or court because one inappropriate post, tweet or message could alter their lives forever.

At the recent virtual National Student Leadership Summit hosted by the NFHS, Christina Jontra of Neptune Navigate, one of the newest NFHS corporate partners, discussed the need for good sportsmanship online as much or more so than on the court or field.

In the digital age in which we live, participants in high school activity programs need to be aware that their character and respect for others should be the same, whether in the sport or activity itself, or online.

As the popularity and influence of social media continues to surge, it is imperative that student-athletes, as well as coaches, administrators, parents and everyone involved in education-based athletics, are aware of the ways they can endanger themselves with their online behavior and understand the techniques they can employ to prevent that from happening.

In her recent presentation, Jontra noted five characteristics of good sportsmanship online – honesty, compassion, respect, responsibility and


courage. Just as a student would respect an opponent on the field or in the debate room, the same must occur online.

At preseason meetings this fall, coaches and athletic/activity directors should encourage students in their programs to be mindful of online contact with individuals on opposing teams – particularly any bantering that could be perceived as cyberbullying. As Jontra mentioned in her message during the NSLS, hurtful words can ruin a person's life forever.

Fortunately, during the season, the millions of high school students involved in sports and performing arts have less free time to spend online on a daily basis, but the time spent must be done in a positive manner. Not only could damaging words on social media affect a student's chances for an athletic scholarship, inappropriate messages could also negatively impact future job possibilities as employers are more actively auditing social media.

Whether the setting is before hundreds of people at an actual game or event, or a private experience alone online, positive and respectful behavior should be the choice every time.

Scholar-Athlete Award in 34th Year Awarding Scholarships to Students

Thousands of students voluntarily extend their classroom day by taking part in extracurricular activities, often improving their academic achievements in the process. The value that such programs play in the total education of a high school student is highlighted through the MHSAA/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award, which will award \$2,000 scholarships to 32 top student-athletes and recognize over 2,000 other outstanding individuals in 2022-23.

Underwritten by Farm Bureau Insurance, the Scholar-Athlete Award is now in its 34th year, and presents scholarships to students in every MHSAA enrollment classification. The scholarships may be used at any institution of higher learning.

"It is amazing to see the number of young people who are proven achievers in academics and activities," said Mark Uyl, executive director of the MHSAA. "At a time when our educational system is coming under fire, the Scholar-Athlete

Award is something that proves how important athletics are to the development of a well-rounded person."

Students applying for the Scholar-Athlete Award must be graduating during the 2022-23 school year, carry a 3.5 grade-point average, and have previously won a letter in a varsity sport that the MHSAA sponsors postseason competition.



Applicants will also be required to show involvement in other school- community activities and submit an essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Each MHSAA member school is allowed to nominate a number of student-athletes based on the size of the school. Class A schools can nominate six boys and six girls, Class B four boys and four girls, Class C three boys and three girls and Class D two boys and two girls. The first 30 scholarships will be awarded based on this graduated scale, with two additional scholarships intended for minority applicants.

A committee composed of school administrators from across the state will select regional and statewide winners.

The 32 scholarship recipients will be recognized at the MHSAA Boys

Basketball Finals at the Breslin Student Events Center in East Lansing in March 2023.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

ight student-athletes who will be juniors at their schools during the 2022-23 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2022-23 are: Kannon Duffing, Manchester; Claire Gorno, Gaylord; M'Khi Guy, Muskegon; Dawsen Lehew, Marcellus; Christian Sanders, Detroit Renaissance; Ben Sytsma, Grand Rapids Christian; Madeline Werner, Bay City All Saints; and DaNia Womack, Dearborn Advanced Tech Academy.

Those eight new members were selected from 115 applicants. That applicant total was the second-most ever, with the last three years featuring the three highest totals.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 129 schools from 48 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic athletics, the Council discusses issues dealing with the 4 S's of educational athletics: scholarship, sportsmanship, safety (including health and nutrition) and the sensible scope of athletic





The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.


